Death of Mrs. H. O'Connor.—The death of Mrs. Hannah O'Connor, of Kilmacthomas, took place at her residence on Thursday evening of last week after an illness of about two months, at a comparatively advanced age. The sad event has evoked feelings of the deepest regret among her wide circle of friends.

Requiem Masses will be celebrated on Thursday evening of last week at 7 o'clock, at the residence of the late Mrs. H. O'Connor, farmer, Ballyboy, Kilmacthomas, and sister of the late Mr. David Power, and the late Rev. Fr. M. Power of honoured memory, the deceased lady was of a most hospitable nature, kind and generous and was an example to all by her devout Catholic life. A prominent and popular figure in local farming, sporting and social circles is her loss. Mr. Cornelius O'Connor, Ballyboy, to whom and the other immediate relatives the sincere sympathy of everyone is extended.

An extremely large and representative cortege accompanied the removal of the remains on the evening of New Year's Day to St. Anne's Church, Fewes, where they were rested overnight on a catafalque before the High Altar. Subsequent to the celebration of Requiem Masses on Saturday morning, interment was made in the adjoining cemetery, and many manifestations of profound sorrow. Very Rev. J. Croly, P.P., Kilsrossney, and Rev. Meehan, C.C., do, were the officiating clergy. A number of beautiful floral wreaths were laid on the grave, and many cards and messages of condolence were received.

Death of Mrs. M. Dunphy.—The death of Mrs. Mary (Minnie) Dunphy, wife of Mr. Patrick Dunphy, farmer, Rockview, Ballyloneen, Kilmacthomas, which took place on New Year's Day, following a somewhat protracted illness has aroused the deepest feelings of sympathy with her devoted husband and family in Kilmacthomas and throughout the Decies.
