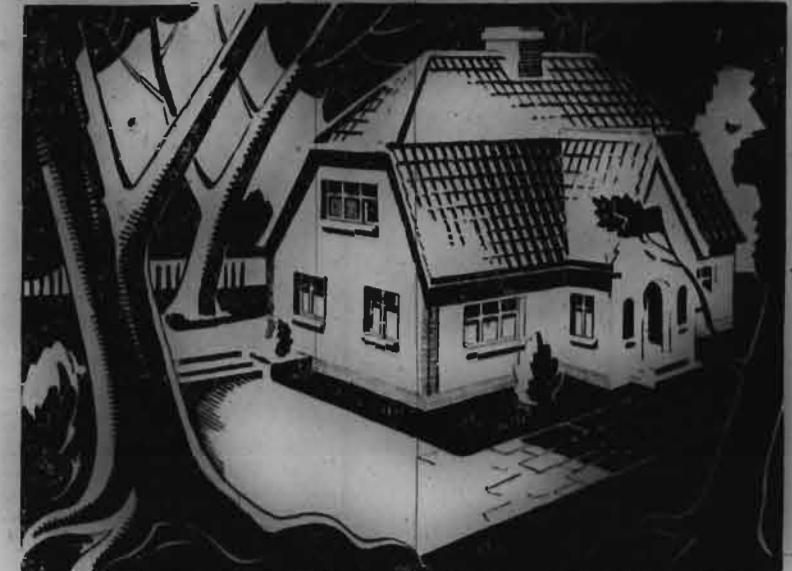

YOUGHAL MEN'S OVERTIME CLAIM.

At the sitting of the High Court on Circuit at Cork, on Wednesday, before Mr. Justice Conroy Maguire, His Lordship decided to state a case on that of the first appellant—and on that of the other two pending the decision on the case stated, in which Michael Dalton, David McGrath and James White, three employees of the Youghal Gas Co., appealed against the dismissal by the Circuit Court Judge of their claims for £218 (£156 in the case of Mr. Dalton) against the Youghal Urban Council (defendants) respondents, amounts alleged to be due to appellants for overtime work done and services rendered.

HIGH COURT JUDGE'S DECISION.

Subsequently, however, at the request of the parties he decided to give judgment. The argument for the (plaintiffs) appellants was that they worked a six-hour week in seven shifts of eight hours each before the Conditions of Employment Act came into operation. Since the Act came into operation it made a standard 48-hour week, and any time worked in excess of that was overtime.

LABOUR NEWS.
