SOCIAL SECURITY

(9) The Conditions of Employment Acts were passed which protected the working conditions of industrial and shop workers.
(10) Building Trade workers have recently been assured against loss of wages resulting from stoppages of work due to bad weather.
(11) Under the Agricultural Wages Board minimum wages have been fixed for agricultural workers.
(12) The Trade Union Act has facilitated the Trade Union Movement to begin the reorganisation necessary to ensure its efficiency.
