AN TAOISEACH AND IRISH LANGUAGE. At the meeting of the Dail Ceannair, held in the Devonshire Arms Hotel, Dungarvan, on Sunday, July 18th, Mr. P. T. Little, Minister for Posts and Telegraphs; Mr. Michael Morrissey, T.D., and Senator Sean Goulding were present from Waterford, Lismore, Kilmacthomas, and Youghal. Messrs. Little and Morrissey addressed the meeting and thanked those present for the herculean work done during the election. They asked delegates to carry back to their respective areas their sincere thanks. They stressed the fact that, were it not for the great teamwork of the organisation, from the Dail Ceannair Officers down to the rank and file of the Cumann, the Fianna Fail party would not be in the happy position it was in today. Senator Goulding also addressed the meeting in Irish and English. He said he wished also to thank all present for their great effort in attempting to return Irish candidates in a four-seat constituency. Instead of having reverses, as they had in other counties, they nearly broke all records in Waterford by almost capturing the third seat. Mr. T. Lincoln, in proposing a vote of thanks to Mr. Kennedy, director of elections, which was seconded by Mr. T. Kelleher, Cappoquin, and with which Mr. Michael O'Ryan wished to be associated, said the great credit possible was due to Mr. Kennedy, who worked nearly 24 hours per day during election time. The Minister, Deputy and Senator also associated themselves with the vote of thanks and paid glowing tributes to Mr. Kennedy. Mr. Kennedy, returning thanks, said it was a pleasure to him to work with such a team, who did all the work, and let him do the driving. He asked those present to collect and send to him the names of all persons in the county, irrespective of their politics, who were interested in the promotion of the Irish language, as he said, An Taoiseach asked him, when he was in Waterford, to send him a list of such people.
