COUNTY BOARD OF PUBLIC ASSISTANCE

Mr. David Coghlan, Chairman, presided at the monthly meeting of the above, held in the Courthouse, Dungarvan, on Monday last. Other members in attendance were Messrs. T. Torpey, J. J. Cosgrove, Wm. Kenneally, M. McGrath, and Senator J. Butler.

Ferrybank Dispensary.—Regarding the correspondence before the last meeting in connection with the Ferrybank Dispensary, Mr. Kenneally said the position now is that the dispensary is now open, but it is not satisfactory yet. He understood the one room is used as a store, and if people attend they must stand in the street until the doctor comes.

Chairman—That's an extraordinary arrangement. Mr. Kenneally—If two patients attend, one must stay in the street while the doctor is examining the other.

Secretary—It seems extraordinary. This is one of those buildings for which the Board is paying a rent to the owner as caretaker. The arrangement was entered into at the time of the Waterford Board of Guardians.

Mr. Kenneally said the population of Ferrybank is 1,700. There is nothing to show that the dispensary is open.

Secretary—Mr. Jephson, engineer, has instructions to have a board erected there.

Mr. Kenneally—The people of Ferrybank were under the impression that there was no dispensary there, and they were going to Peter Street. Dr. McCarthy has been at the dispensary all right, and the only complaint now is about accommodation. The whole thing will be got over by making known the dispensary days and hours, as there is nothing there to show those.

Secretary—Mr. Jephson will have this board erected.

Mr. Kenneally—The next step is the appointment of wardens. I do not know if there is any warden in Ferrybank. They should at least have two, one in Sallypark and the other in Ferrybank.

The Secretary said it is his impression that the caretaker of the dispensary is also a warden.

Mr. Kenneally submitted the names of the following to be recommended as wardens: James B. Freeman, 2, St. John's, Ferrybank; J. J. Sutton, or Mrs. O'Shaughnessy, Upper Ferrybank; and Miss S. O'Neill, Sallypark. This suggestion was approved by the Board.

From Station of Timber.—Arising out of the Board's resolution at the previous meeting directing the Secretary to write to the Waterford agent of Fuel Importers, Ltd., asking that some of the huge stock of timber stored in the city be released and sold to the poor.

Mr. S. Norris, agent, wrote enclosing a reply received from the Department of Supplies in reply to a similar resolution from the Waterford Corporation, in which the Department refused the request of the Corporation, stating the timber was being held as an iron ration in case of a major emergency. The request of the Board of Assistance had been forwarded to the Department of Supplies by the writer.

The Chairman said he understood this timber is out in the open. Ferrybank's opinion the timber will not be worth twopenny as an iron ration.

Mr. Cosgrove asked what is an iron ration. The Chairman said it is a ration of goods, that he said, has come long ago to the poor people, who are not able to have a fire.

Mr. Kenneally said there must be some 30,000 tons of timber in this particular place. The timber was in about six feet lengths, and it is being cut into fireblocks during the past 12 months.

Mr. Butler—There is no reply so far to the Board's resolution?

Secretary—No.

Mr. Cosgrove suggested asking the four T.D.s to move in this matter. He himself is unable to get timber.

Mr. Kenneally—The trouble is that if it is released in Waterford it must be released all over.

Secretary—Are the Corporation taking any further steps in the matter?

Mr. Kenneally—No. When the price of timber was controlled, all those who were supplying timber had to stop. The turf is definitely bad—you can't light it.

The matter was referred to the Dail members.

In his report, the Secretary stated that there were now 68 members in the branch, and that all were clear with the organisation during the past year. Final appeals were sent by the organiser to the associated teachers in the area, and as a result of them had joined the branch. There were now only three unassociated teachers in the area. The new rule governing membership became operative in the branch. Three members of the branch received grants from the illness fund during 1943. The branch contributed £6.12s. to the widows and orphans' fund and £5 to the Hurley memorial fund.

The Secretary's report was adopted, and he was complimented on the healthy state of the branch.

Council Adjourns.—Mr. M. Clancy said that since their last meeting one of their colleagues, Mr. McGrath, had suffered a great loss by the death of his brother, Rev. Dr. McGrath, a distinguished Churchman of the Augustinian Order. This loss was deeply felt by his family, coming as it did so suddenly. Proposing that the meeting adjourn, Mr. Clancy said that Rev. Dr. McGrath was born in Dungarvan 72 years ago, and many of the older people knew him as a child and as a boy, before he went away.
