KILMACHTHOMAS NOTES.

Passing of An Esteemed Kilmachthomas Parishioner.—Deep and widespread regret was expressed in the hearts of the Deise country when it became known that Mrs. Mary Anne Power, of Adramone, Kilmachthomas, had passed away to her eternal rest. Her demise was not quite unexpected as this good lady was in indifferent health for some time past. She bore the trials of a protracted illness with Christian patience and resignation and died a truly holy and happy death on Thursday morning (19th inst.), in the fullness of her years. Sprung from most respected Kilmachthomas family stock—the Powers of Mountkenedy—the deceased was a fine type of Irish womanhood. Pious, charitable and respectable, she possessed all those noble characteristics of the typical Irish Catholic wife and mother. Educated at the Convent of the Sacred Heart, School, Lismore, and the Mid Waterford area, she was heavily influenced following last week's torrential rainfall as they were the unfortunate victims of October deluges of 1917 and 1911, respectively.
