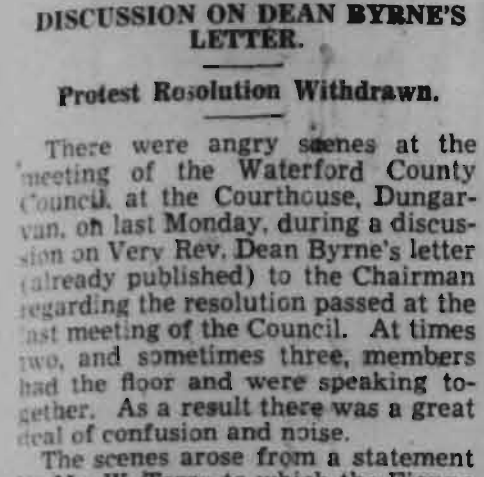

INCREASE IN WATERFOOD COUNTY RATE.

4d. IN & OVER LAST YEAR. Senator J. Butler (Chairman) presided at the Estimates meeting of the Waterford County Council, at the Courthouse, Dungarvan, on Monday last. Other members present were: Messrs. W. Power, M. Hartly, M. McGrath, M. Morrissey, T.D.; W. Terry, L. A. Veale, D. Coghlan, D. Foran, M. O'Ryan, P. R. Power, D. Heskin, T.D., T. Duggan, J. Quinn, M. F. Walsh, R. Harney, J. Kirwan, G. Torpey, Messrs. S. J. Moynihan, Co. Manager, J. G. Dowling, Co. Secretary, J. O'Rourke, Assistant County Surveyor, and the Assistant Co. Surveyors, were also present.

£2,000 under this head for portion of the estimated refund of withheld estate duty grant was also being taken. The Dungarvan Council would be credited with its due proportion of this. In the increase in public assistance (which was actually considerably more credit was taken for £2,000 estimated receipts from withheld estate duty grant. In addition to the estimated receipts from the estate duty grant in the coming year, further credit has been taken in the estimates in respect of withheld agricultural grants already received.

Continuing the County Manager referred to new social schemes which had come into operation—supplementary allowances, T.B. welfare, footwear, etc.—which, he said, had placed considerable additional burden on the rates. the best value farmers got for their rates was good roads. He agreed to add the £3,000 to the estimate. Mr. Morrissey referred to the letter from the Department, and asked if the £2,236 could be added to the estimate. That would only leave a balance of a little over £1,000 to be provided for. In other words, it meant about 1d. more in the £ increase. They were bearing complaints continuously about the condition of the roads. The roads were the only source of value to farmers for the rates they were paying. He would suggest that the extra 1d. be added to the rates. Mr. Quirk, seconding, said that the Ballyduff road was in a deplorable condition, and the people there would not object to paying a few pence extra in the £.
