One Man Killed and Two Missing. On last Wednesday morning, while pursuing their peaceful occupation of fishermen off Helvic Head, tragedy swiftly and sudden overcame the crew of a Helvic fishing trawler.

The names of the victims are John Griffin (73), widower, Knockenpower, Ring; John Griffin, his son (41), who lives with him, and Nicholas Cuddihy (40), Ballinagoul. The survivor is Patrick Whelan, married, Helvic.

The sad tragedy occurred about nine miles off the Head, and is believed to have been caused by a mine which had got caught in the fishing trawl of the boat as it was being hauled on board.
