IRISH IN THE COURTS UNDER BRITISH REGIME

Now that so much of the business of the District Courts is conducted in the native tongue, the following extract, taken from "Irisleabhar Na Gaedhige," will be of interest: "The Dungarvan Town Commissioners unanimously passed the following resolution on the 4th Feb., 1945, on the motion of Mr. Thomas O'Connor, seconded by Mr. James J. Ryan: 'Resolved: That the Dungarvan Town Commissioners, request the representatives of the County and City of Waterford to call the attention of the Lord Chancellor and Chief Secretary for Ireland to the system practised in some of the law courts of this country, namely, the forcing of Irish-speaking witnesses, under the threat of imprisonment, to give their evidence in the English language, notwithstanding the declarations of such witnesses of their inability to do so, having but a very imperfect knowledge of the English tongue, but most anxious to give evidence in their native tongue; and we desire to impress on the Chief Secretary and Lord Chancellor the very great necessity that exists when appointing Resident Magistrates and others to the commission of the peace for Ireland in the future, to make it a condition of such appointments that all such Justices should possess a knowledge of the Irish language; and that all Magistrates at present acting in our courts be requested to take the evidence of all Irish-speaking witnesses in the Irish language, and their interpreters generally attached to the courts.'

WATERFORD FOOTBALLERS GOOD DISPLAY

S.F.—Tipperary, 0-7; Waterford, 3-1. M.F.—Tipperary, 1-7; Waterford, 2-2. Tipperary registered a double in the opening rounds of the Munster Championships at Carrick-on-Suir on Sunday, when they defeated Waterford in senior and minor football. The minor game was closely fought and full-time found the teams level, the scores being, Tipperary, 1-4; Waterford, 2-2. In extra time Tipperary won by two points. In the senior match Tipperary won by 7 points to three. Waterford opened the scoring with a point after three minutes play. Tipperary then equalised and added four more points before Waterford got their second score. On the turn-over Tipperary added a further point and after three successive misses from free approximately 28 yards, scored another point before Waterford replied with their last score.
