BOARD OF ASSISTANCE DISCUSSION.

The dietary scale drawn up for the inmates of the Dungarvan County Home was subjected to severe criticism by the members of Waterford Board of Assistance...

The matter was raised by Senator Butler at the last meeting of the Board, when he asked the Secretary to have the dietary scale for the next meeting...

INMATES' DIET. The scale provided for each inmate is 3 ozs. of corned beef (formerly bacon, which is not available now) on Sundays and Thursdays...

Secretary—Yes. Senator Butler—I think it is shocking. I won't say anything else, only that it is shocking.

Mr. Morrissey said some shocking statements had been made about the inmates at the County Home...

Secretary—Six months, from the 1st October to the end of May. Mr. Morrissey—How long is the contract for?

Secretary—You would get them then. There are lots of potatoes grown here then that are sent up to Dublin.
