POTATO BLIGHT: 100 Years Ago and Now.

(Continued from last week.) It is only reasonable to assume that "blight" was actually established here for some years prior to the severe outbreaks which occurred in 1846 and the following years. Disease was first recorded in England in 1844, and in 1845 the malady had spread over a large part of that country by August 11th. In September, 1845, potato crops in Ireland were found to be affected, but the losses due to blight in that year were of no great significance, and gave little indication of what was to happen in the year following.

In the space of one short week—July 27th to August 3rd, 1846—"luxuriant growth" was transformed into "putrefying vegetation," as seen by Father Matthew, and recorded in this column last week. Other contemporary accounts bear witness to the sudden and extensive nature of the disease in that fatal year.

Reporting on the situation in West Clare, one Captain Mann wrote: "The first alarm was in the latter part of July, when the potatoes showed symptoms of the previous year's growth, but I shall never forget the change in one week in August. On the first occasion, on an official visit of inspection, I had passed over 32 miles studded with potato fields in full bloom. The next time the face of the whole country was changed; the stalks remained green but the leaves were all scorched black. It was the work of a night."

The exact cause of blight remained a mystery for some time, but eventually scientists discovered that it was a case of one plant attacking another. Later still, science gave us the means of combating the attack and thereby preventing, or greatly minimizing, the damage caused to the would-be victim—the potato plant. The attacker, a tiny, whitish plant, of the mildew type, thrives best in damp, warm weather, and travels from plant to plant by means of minute seeds or "spores."
