Dungarvan District Court.

At the Dungarvan District Court on Tuesday, before Mr. E. O. Riain, D.A., Mr. M. Power, Loughmore, had a civil bill claim against Wm. Crofty, Loughmore, for damage caused to onion and cabbage plants by a trespass of a donkey, the property of defendant.

Mr. A. R. Farrelly (Messrs. Farrell and Morrissey) for the plaintiff, Mr. J. P. Kenny (E. A. Ryan and Co.) for the defendant.

Mr. Kenny said that his client was admitting the trespass and the question to be decided was the value of the damage caused.

Mr. M. Power, plaintiff, who said he was an occupant of a Dungarvan Urban Council house, stated that on the morning of August 27th he found a donkey in the garden of his house.

On the following morning witness found the donkey again in the garden and he had a surveyor look over the onion and cabbage. Witness said that the plants were not damaged.

The Justice said that it seemed to him that the amount of damage by the plaintiff was not unreasonable, having regard to the fact that the defendant gave no evidence against the plaintiff.

Guard T. Burke summoned Andrew Cawley, no fixed abode, for being drunk and disorderly.

Mr. A. R. Farrelly (for defendant) said his clients admitted the offence and wished to apologise. They gave an undertaking that it would not occur again.
