Cavan are 1947 All-Ireland Senior Football Champions. They achieved the "seemingly impossible" at the Polo Grounds, New York, as during the first half Kerry, the reigning champions, had gained an eight points' lead and were playing with such dash and cleverness that it certainly looked as if Cavan were doomed to defeat.

But Cavan were apparently just warming to their work. They launched attack after attack and with sparkling scores wiped out Kerry's commanding lead and were in front by a point at the interval.

This amazing game had in it the combined thrills of a dozen finals, with its wonderful Kerry start, Cavan's grand, glorious fighting come-back, and again Kerry's last-minute effort to pull the game out of the fire.

It was a proud, happy and memorable moment for Ireland when, with the Stars and Stripes flying side by side with the Tricolour, that huge assemblage rose to the Irish National Anthem.
