ORMONDE ELECTED

The checking and counting of the votes in the Waterford By-election took place in the City Hall, Waterford, on Thursday morning, under the direction of Mr. T. A. Colbert, returning officer. When the checking of the ballot boxes was completed, it was announced that the total number of valid votes cast out of an electorate of 51,000 was 32,222. There were 231 spoiled votes.

Death of Mrs. A. Veale

Mrs. Anastasia (O'Toole) Veale, widow of Patrick Veale, died on Monday, September 22, at her home of her son, William Veale, 96 Walnut Street, Chicopee, Falls, Mass., U.S.A. She was within a month of the 100th anniversary of her birthday. Deeds of the fact that she had been in declining health for the past two years, Mrs. Veale had been able to do much sewing, and one of her final accomplishments was to sew the dress in which she was buried. Born in Sheadally, Co. Waterford, on 2nd October, 1847, Mrs. Veale was the daughter of James O'Toole and the former Mary Dalton. Her father was born in 1779 and died in 1864 and her mother, born in 1779, died in 1864. She was 100 years of age. She came to the United States in a sailing ship in 1862 and lived at Northampton, Mass. for some time before returning to Ireland in 1867. She was married in Stradbally and returned to the United States in 1896 and since then has made her home in the western part of Massachusetts. All her children were born in Ireland, death claiming two in their native land and one died in Northampton, Mass.

Mrs. Veale leaves four sons—James F. and William J., both of Chicopee, Falls, and Thomas P. and Patrick J. of Chicopee, Falls, and three daughters—Mrs. John Powers, of Northampton; Mrs. Della Hamilton, of Seattle, Washington; and Mrs. Clayton, of Jacksons Heights, New York. She also leaves 32 grand-children and 15 great-grand-children. Among her grandchildren are—Rev. Patrick J. Veale, Society of Saint Joseph, Washington, D.C.; Rev. James Veale Hamilton, of Goldensale, Washington; Sister M. Regina, S.N.D., of Boston, Mass.; Sister M. Antonia, of Richmond, Virginia; and Rev. Brother Basil John F. S.C.J., stationed at La Salle Institute, Troy, New York. The funeral of Mrs. Veale took place on Wednesday evening, September 23rd, with a Solemn High Mass in St. Patrick's Church, Chicopee, Falls, Rev. Patrick Veale S.J., officiating. Burial was in St. Patrick's Cemetery.
