DUNGARVAN COURT

The Dungarvan District Court was held on last Tuesday, before District Justice E. O. Ryan. CIVIL BILL CLAIM. The civil bill of Mr. P. Keady, Old Cappagh House, Cappagh, against John McGrath, same address, for trespass, adjourned from a previous court, Mr. A. R. Farrell (Messrs. Farrell and Morrissey) for the plaintiff, referred to a suggestion made by Mr. T. C. Williams (who appeared for the defendant) at the previous court to the effect that the case be adjourned pending a settlement regarding the yard on which the trespass was alleged to have been committed, and he (Mr. Farrell) said that he sent the agreement to Mr. Williams to have it signed, but got no answer. He then proposed Mr. Williams and he informed Mr. Farrell that his client (defendant) was not prepared to sign it.

Mr. Williams said that the question of title was being brought in now. The Justice asked how the question of the title could come in now as the Circuit Court Judge had already decided on the case. Mr. Williams said that when the case was before Judge Sealy there was no question of title. What was before the Circuit Court was the question of fixing a rent and also the question of a plot of ground. Judge Sealy held that his (Mr. Williams) client had no right to use this plot of ground.

Mr. Farrell thought it was unfair for the defendant to raise that point now. It should be raised at the last court. The Justice said that the defendant would be well advised to keep to the settlement made on the last occasion. The defendant's case was that he used the yard since 1935 and that he has a right to use it. That was a matter for the Circuit Court Judge to settle. If the Circuit Court Judge upheld the defendant's case, then that disposed of the case; if he didn't, then the plaintiff could come back to him (Justice) on the question of damages. The Justice adjourned the case to the last court in February.

CLAIM FOR SHEEP. Thomas Keane, farmer, Bailinaylor, had a civil bill claim for £3 against Michael O'Callaghan, North Mall, Cork, in respect of the sale of a sheep. Mr. A. R. Farrell for plaintiff. There was no appearance for defendant. Mr. Keane, plaintiff's son, said that on July 10th at Dungarvan fair the sheep was sold to the defendant for £3. The defendant gave witness a docket (produced) which stated that the sheep was purchased for £3. The money had not been paid. A decree for the amount claimed was given.

OCCASIONAL LICENCES. Mr. T. C. Williams, on behalf of Mr. P. I. Power, was granted occasional licences for the Town Hall for December 14th (Ballinamult Show Society Dance), January 1st, 1948 (Dungarvan Coursing Club Dance), and January 6th (Dungarvan Snow Committee Dance).

EXEMPTION ORDER. Mr. T. C. Williams, on behalf of Mrs. Mary Egan, Egan's Hotel, Dungarvan, was granted a special exemption order for the night of December 6th from 9.30 to 12 midnight.

Mr. Farrell, pleading guilty on behalf of his client, said that his client had never been before the court on any offence. His case was that at that time there was no timber in the town—and even since it was not available it could not be got for love or money. He got the timber from Lismore. Mr. Hallahan had engaged to get the timber six weeks before the order was made and he thought he was not committing any offence when he had engaged to get the timber before the order was made. Mr. Hallahan said he had never been before the court on any offence. The Justice said he had bought 5 tons 8 cwt. of timber in Lismore.

Mr. Farrell—How long before the 25th did you engage to get it? Witness—About five or six weeks. I wrote about getting the timber from him. I am getting timber from him for some years. Continuing witness said that the man in Lismore told him he had the timber and to send a lorry for it. Witness approached two lorry owners, before he got the lorry that brought it down, about getting the timber down but they could not go. The timber was brought to witness's house about 8 o'clock in the evening and was afterwards confiscated by the Inspector. The timber was very mixed. Fuel Importers opened an office in O'Connell Street but it was closed up again some time after.

Mr. Farrell—Are you aware why it was closed? Witness—They could not get timber. On the 25th June were you aware that this Order was in force? I was. Were you under the impression that you could get the timber because you had engaged for it prior to the Order being made? I was. To the Justice, witness said he was paid for the timber that was confiscated. Witness had paid £21 10s to get the timber from Lismore and to take it from his residence to Fuel Importers yard. Justice—I take it this is the first offence under the Order. Mr. Counahan—in Dungarvan at any rate. The Justice said he was satisfied that there were extenuating circumstances in Mr. Hallahan's case. The timber was purchased by him for his own use and prior to the making of the Order. "He brought it in," continued the Justice, "quite openly and could be seen by anybody, and was in fact seen by the Inspector." Continuing, the Justice said that Mr. Hallahan paid for carrying it from Lismore to his residence and from his residence to Fuel Importers' yard. This being the first prosecution of its kind, he (Justice) took it that it was being brought to bring the existence of the Order to the notice of the public. He fined the defendant 5s, with 4s 6d expenses. The case was then taken against

Compulsory Tillage for 1948

THE Tillage Order, 1947, made by the Government on the 21st November, 1947, provides for compulsory tillage of wheat growing in 1948 to the same extent as in 1947. Subject to certain exceptions, every owner of a holding of 2 or more statute acres of arable land will therefore, again be required to cultivate in 1948 the whole of such land and any wheat thereon a specified minimum area equal to one-fifth, one-sixteenth, or one-twentieth of the arable area according to the district in which the holding is situated.

A person who fails to carry out his obligation under the Tillage Order may be prosecuted and liable on conviction to a heavy fine or imprisonment, or to both fine and imprisonment.
