DUNGARVAN COURT

The Dungarvan District Court was held on Tuesday, before District Justice O'Riain.

BREACHES OF BUTTER ORDER.
The Minister for Industries and Commerce charged Mrs. Esther Mackey, O'Connell Street, Dungarvan, with (1) selling butter in excess of the retail price of 2s. 8d. per lb. in contravention of the Butter Emergency Order, 1947 (Section 3); (2) selling butter to a person who was not a registered butter customer in her premises. Both offences were stated to have happened on May 26th, 1947.

Mrs. Bridget Giblin, O'Connell St., who it was stated was an unregistered butter customer of above defendant, was charged with buying a lb. of butter at the rate of 3s. 10d. per lb.

Mr. J. F. Kenny (E. A. Ryan and Co., Soirs), acted for Mr. D. R. Counihan, State Solicitor; Mr. T. C. Williams (J. F. Williams and Son, Solicitors), for Mrs. Bridget Giblin, and Mr. P. J. Morrissey (Messrs. Farrell and Morrissey, Solicitors), for Mrs. Esther Mackey.

Pleas admitting the offences were entered by both defendants.

An Inspector of the Department of Industry and Commerce said he investigated the case and ascertained that on May 24th Teresa Giblin, daughter of Mrs. Bridget Giblin, purchased a lb. of butter in Mrs. Mackey's shop and was charged 3s. 10d., which was at the rate of 3s. 8d. per lb., or 2s. in excess of the fixed price.

Mr. Kenny—Do you know what kind of butter it was? Witness—It was farmers' butter.

Witness added that a shopkeeper could not charge in excess of 2s. 8d. a lb. for any butter.

Witness, continuing, said he interviewed Mrs. Mackey and Mrs. Giblin and asked Giblin what she had to say. Cross-examined by Mr. Morrissey, witness said he understood that Mrs. Mackey was not long in business.

Mr. Morrissey—Did she tell you what price she paid for it? Witness—She mentioned 3s. 6d.

Is it not the general custom to sell it at that price? I could not say.

Did Mrs. Mackey say to you that she was getting tired of all these Government Orders? Witness—Yes, she said she was getting tired of all these Government Orders and that she was selling out her business altogether? She did not.

And she is out of business now? I understand so.

Mr. Kenny said that the prosecution was not suggesting that any profit in the sense implied against Mrs. Mackey.

Mr. Morrissey said that the position was that Mrs. Mackey had a short business experience prior to this in a small shop in Dungarvan. She bought the premises and licence from Mrs. Giblin and her husband, who had been 25 years in the Garda Force, left it, and carried on business there. There had a great deal of difficulty in connection with these Government Orders and the quo. as regards this shop. Mrs. Mackey was registered as the owner and also the licensee. She did purchase the butter and paid to her knowledge the usual price paid in Dungarvan, namely, 3s. 6d. a lb. She said the butter cost 3s. 8d. a lb.—a profit of 2d. Mrs. Mackey did not realise she was committing any offence at the time she sold the butter. She was only nine or ten months in business at the time.

Mrs. Mackey, in evidence, said that she and her husband carried on a joint business but the butter licence was in her name.

Mr. Morrissey—You admit selling the butter to Mrs. Giblin for 3s. 10d.? Witness—Yes.

Did you purchase it from a farmer earlier that day? Yes.

And what were you charged? 3s. 8d.

You sold it at 3s. 8d.? Yes.

You had a great deal of difficulty about these Government Orders? Yes, we were very small.

In further evidence, witness said that she had since sold the business.

Mr. Williams, on behalf of his client, Mrs. Giblin, said that she heard that Mrs. Mackey was selling the butter and she sent her daughter for it.

Justice—When things are in short supply it is only human nature to try and get them. You are right, they were very small.

Mr. Morrissey said that as far as he understood about the Orders in connection with butter at that time was that certain Orders did not apply to country butter, but did to creamery butter. In fact, he understood that it was the general practice to charge 3s. 8d. and 3s. 8d. and even 3s. 10d. a lb. for the country butter.

The Justice said he was satisfied that though the defendant, Mrs. Mackey, had overcharged, it was not the usual case of profiteering. Mrs. Mackey had sworn that about that time she was under the impression that she could sell farmers' butter at a price above the price of creamery butter. He imposed a fine of £2 for selling butter in excess of the fixed price and 3s. for selling butter to an unregistered customer. He allowed 3s. 8d. expenses.

In regard to the charge against Mrs. Giblin, the Justice said that Mr. Williams had stated that she heard from some neighbour that she could get butter from Mrs. Mackey. It was a very human thing to go and purchase something if short supply for the benefit of one's children. He

THE NEW BUDGET TAXES.

To the Editor, Dungarvan Observer.

Dear Sir—Will you kindly give me space in your valuable paper for the following:

I have been approached by several licensed traders (publicans), town and country, suggesting that a meeting of traders should be called at an early date with a view to placing before the candidates for the forthcoming General Election the serious plight of the trade as a result of the recent Budget imposition of taxes on stout, tobacco, etc.

It is felt that some drastic demonstrations must be made to bring home to the powers that be that these taxes have caused widespread discontent and unrest, not alone in the trade but also amongst the workers, who can ill afford to have their pint of beer and their plug of tobacco made so cruelly prohibitive.

I accordingly agreed to arrange for a public meeting to be called at an early date to discuss ways and means of meeting the situation. Personally, I am largely interested in the matter, and suggest that all publicans and tobacconists who are interested send me a postcard approving of such a meeting, when I shall be pleased to notify a date for same.

At such a meeting we could invite representatives of the various parties of the Waterford constituency.

MILK PRICES

To the Editor, "Dungarvan Observer." Dear Sir,—note from a discussion at the Dungarvan Urban Council at their last meeting on the above subject that it was stated that the further increase in the price of milk will be made by the retailers because the price charged to them by the registered milk producers is to be increased.

The position as it stands at the moment is that registered milk producers are willing to supply the retailers with milk at 2s. the gallon at registered producers' premises provided the retailers sell it to the public at 2s. 6d. the gallon. Producers are of opinion that 6d. per gallon is ample margin for handling and to allow a profit, but while the retailers are charging the maximum retail price (i.e., 2s. 8d. per gallon), the registered milk producers demand that we get 2s. 2d. per gallon.

From the public health point of view only milk produced by those registered under the Milk and Dairies Act should be offered for public consumption, and we know that the complaint about the fact that milk from non-registered producers was being offered to the public was recently made to the County M.O.H., who is, we understand, investigating the matter.

To conclude, we wish to point out that the offer of the registered milk producers to sell milk to the retailers at 2s. per gallon provided they sell to the public at 2s. 6d. per gallon still holds good, and this offer is as up to date in the minds of the public as to who is responsible for any increases in the price of milk.
