James Keane (defendant) said he sounded his horn repeatedly from the church to about 15 yards from the cross as there were people on the road. It was raining heavily and there was a gale blowing. When the accident occurred he was travelling at about 12 miles an hour. Timothy Foley (defendant) stated that he was on his wrong side when struck. He went across to that side to save the harvest. He had to work 24 hours a day and could not attend to the remaining weeds. He submitted that there were mitigating circumstances. The Justice imposed a fine of £6 10s.

QUESTIONS IN THE DAIL

In the Dail recently, Deputy Ormond (P.F., Waterford) asked the Minister for Industry and Commerce if he is aware (a) that Messrs. Irish Tanners' Factory at Portlaoighe, County Waterford, is on a five-day week of 40 hours for some time owing to a continued shortage of hides which has compelled the management to reduction; (b) that this shortage is due to foreign hides being in short supply and, with the return of conditions in the cattle trade approximating to pre-war times, to large numbers of store cattle leaving the country alive; and, if so, whether he will endeavour to come to some arrangement with the British Authorities whereby hides of Irish cattle will be made available to meet the requirements of the Irish Tanners?

The Minister's reply reads:—'Though I am aware that there is a shortage at present of the hides suitable for the production of a particular class of leather, I am not aware that there is any overall shortage of hides which has compelled Irish Tanners, Ltd., to reduce production of leather. On the contrary, I have been told that the reduction in output is due to falling off in the demand for leather by footwear manufacturers and others. The footwear manufacturers have made representations to me about difficulty in disposing of their output of footwear, and I am having the whole position examined at present. In the mean time, I have promised that facilities will be granted to Irish Tanners, Ltd., to enable them to export surplus leather they have on hand. The matter to which the Deputy refers in the latter part of his question will be examined.'
