BODY FOUND IN COLLIGAN WOOD

Identified as Missing Ring Farmer.

Three Months' Old Mystery Solved.

EVIDENCE AT INQUEST.

The mystery surrounding the three months' disappearance of James Curran (50), married, farmer, Ballinacorty, Ring, was solved on last Saturday evening when a body, subsequently identified as his, was found lying under a tree in Colligan Wood. Looped round the neck was a broken cord, and hanging from the tree under which the body was lying, was the end of a cord similar to that around the neck.

The medical evidence at the inquest (which was adjourned) was that death was caused by strangulation. The inquest was held at Lawlor's Hotel late on Saturday night by Dr. D. T. McCarthy, West Waterford. The jury—Messrs. D. McGrath (foreman); C. Quigley, J. Carroll, J. Power (Abbeyside); M. Kelly, D. Walsh, J. McGrath (St. Mary Street); N. Casper.

Supt. P. O'Mahony and Sergeant J. Liddane represented the authorities. Dr. M. Casey, Dungarvan, said he

examined the remains at 9 p.m. that night. Witness found him lying on his back, slightly turned towards the right side. The knees were flexed and the left knee was held tightly by a branch of a tree, which he was lying on. The eyes were eaten out by rodents. There was a cord around his neck, similar to the cord around the tree, the ends of which were hanging. The body was in an advanced state of decomposition and there were no marks of violence on it. He was dead a few months. The body was fully clothed.

Coroner—Having considered all the facts, what is your opinion of the cause of his death?

Witness—Death by strangulation.

Coroner—Would you consider it self-inflicted?

Witness—From all the appearances no one could come to any other conclusion.

Supt. O'Mahony said that a boy knew was that the deceased left his home in the small hours of the morning fully dressed as he was found and described by his wife. Nobody had seen or heard of him since until somebody that day (Saturday) went into the wood and saw the body. He pushed the Cappagh Barracks and the Guards went out and found the body as described by Casey. There was a cord round his neck, which he had seen several times and four strands of it were hanging down. There is a hole in the tree, which was broken, and other marks on a branch above that, on the "gowlings" where it also joined the tree as if he stood on it there. The body appeared to have fallen. The twine appeared to have

been broken when the weight came on it, or it might have rotted away. His cap was underneath him.

After evidence of identification had been given by John Curran, a nephew of deceased, which said he last saw deceased alive 4 weeks before he disappeared and was in good health then, the Coroner said this had been a great shock to the deceased's widow and she would be unable to give evidence. He therefore proposed to adjourn the inquest to a future date, and the jury would receive due notice when it would be resumed.

After the Coroner had expressed his sympathy with the widow and relatives of the deceased, and in which Supt. O'Mahony, on behalf of the Dungarvan and Ring Garda, and the foreman of the jury, on behalf of the other members of the jury, joined, the inquest was adjourned.
