Attack on Chairman

At a meeting of the Co. Board, G.A.A., Saturday night last, Very Rev. P. D. Cummins, presiding, Mr. Foley, M.A., said he wished to refer to a letter appearing in another local paper (not the "Observer") from a writer signing himself Patrick B. Fahy casting aspersions on the Chairman and County Board. The letter dealt with the recent ruling of the Board that the constitution of the Avonmore team was invalid. Mr. Foley took particular exception to one part of the letter, which stated: "When, however, it (Avonmore) gained success by winning the championship of the West in 1948 and went into the County Final the Dungarvan Club objected. The objection was overruled by the then County Chairman, but another year dawned and another Chairman was elected who was more amenable to the wishes of the Dungarvan Club."

"The Board," said Mr. Foley, "should take strong exception to this statement. It is tantamount to saying that the Chairman is a tool of the Dungarvan Club. The Rev. Chairman did all in his power to include Avonmore. This was a most untruthful statement and the man who made it should not be allowed get away with it."

The Rev. Chairman said this matter was a personal attack on himself. When summed up it meant that he had come in here to defend the County of the Dungarvan Club. He never came into this Board to be an instrument of anybody. This attack was made on him by a man who he did not even know or never saw. "We Gaels," he said, "should never stoop so low as to attack one another in the press. It was not necessary," he continued, "for a priest to reply. The attack, even though proven false, was nevertheless injurious. He assured those present that he had every intention of his power to retaliate. He even put the case before a Munster Council official, who told him that as a team Avonmore was not properly constituted. He had got legal opinion on the attack and was told it was libellous."

The Rev. Chairman then vacated the chair to give the Board an opportunity to discuss the matter. Mr. C. Curran, Chairman of the Western Board, taking the chair, said he could be witness to the fact that the Chairman was Avonmore to take part in the championships. After some discussion on the letter, Mr. Farling said the inaccuracies in the letter could be corrected by the County Board but the part they were concerned with was the portion attacking the Chairman.

Mr. Foley—This is an attack on the Chairman and what protection are you going to give him? Secretary—It is a very serious charge, against the Gaels of the county. A grave reflection has been made on this Board to-night. Mr. Ware remarked that when an attack was made on the last Chairman, the man who stood up for him was very quiet to-night.

Mr. O'Sullivan—The Board should get a public apology on all papers from the writer.

Mr. Griffin—Why not deal with him as an individual?

Mr. Byrne suggested that the matter be handed over to the Board's legal authority. Mr. O'Dea suggested that this man get five days to appear before the next meeting. Some discussion followed as to whether he was a member of any club, it being noted from the letter that he was the first Chairman of the Avonmore Club. Mr. Foley said he understood that the ruling of the Central Council was that an Irishman was eligible to be an executive in position in the Association until such time as he was suspended. Mr. O'Dea proposed that the Board, on behalf of the Chairman, instruct a solicitor to write the person concerned, if it meets with the Chairman's wishes. It was finally decided to ask Mr. Fahy to appear before next meeting after which the Board would take appropriate action and also to make a public protest in the press.
