Waterford Board of Assistance Secretary Retires After 55 Years' Service.

The annual general meeting of the Waterford Board of Assistance, held at the Courthouse, Dungarvan, on Monday last, Mr. P. Caulfield, chairman, presided. Also present were Messrs. M. O'Ryan, M. McGrath, W. Kenneally, R. Barron, P. O'Connor, T. Dugan, T. A. Kyne, T.D., and Senator Butler. The County Manager (Mr. S. Moynihan) was also in attendance.

On the proposal of Senator Butler, seconded by Mr. McGrath, the outgoing Chairman (Mr. P. Caulfield) was unanimously re-elected chairman. Senator Butler in making the proposal, said that throughout the past the Chairman had at all times given them an excellent service and it was only right that they avail of that service for the future twelve months.

Senator Butler proposed, and Mr. Dugan seconded, that the Vice-Chairman (Mr. Kyne) be re-elected. The proposal again being unanimously passed.

Superannuation Act (Part III) Adopted.—The following resolution moved by Senator Butler was adopted: That the Waterford Board of Public Assistance hereby decide to adopt Part III of the Local Government Act, 1948, and from the 1st day of October, 1949, and that it is hereby declared that the maximum number of persons to be at any time in the employment of the Waterford Board of Public Assistance as permanent servants shall be 20.

Proposed Maternity Wing.—The report submitted by the committee in charge of their visit to the old offices at the County Home to decide if they would be suitable for conversion into a maternity wing, stated that as it was hoped to convert them into nurseries, it would not be possible for them to go any further with their proposals in this matter until they have further information as to the nurses' quarters. The architect's plans were explained to the members and it was pointed out that as they had to be sent for approval it would be better to adjourn the matter until they hear further on it.

Mr. O'Ryan stated that he thought that they should consider before the start of the next year the expenditure. He asked which would be vacated by the transfer of T.S. patients to the new hospital at Lismore. He said he thought they would help out in this matter before the start of the next year.

Senator Butler stated it was the intention to allocate one of these wards for the cancer patients and one for children which embodied all that required for very urgent needs. He said that with regard to the staff accommodation it was a great necessity as conditions were being improved and housed at present were primitive and it was indeed a shame to have them there at all.

Mr. Kyne here endorsed Senator Butler's remarks. At this point it was stated that the matter was not to be discussed at this meeting and it had yet to go before the Minister, then it would be time enough to discuss it when they had his decision and when they knew what the grant would be.

The architect's report stated that the accommodation required would be for 25 domestic and 7 nursing staff, including maternity nurses. They would require double bedrooms, bathrooms box room, linen room, library and reading room, visitors' room, sanitary arrangements and central heating.
