MAKE WAR ON LICE. Lice pass from person to person, and may carry deadly disease. In order to avoid infection, keep these rules in view: (1) Brush and comb the hair thoroughly at least once a day, and wash it regularly. (2) When going to bed, always change completely from day clothes. (3) Change underclothing at least once a week after washing, clothing should be ironed, special attention being given to the seams. If you become infested through contact with verminous persons, or if lice are detected in your dwelling, go at once to your local Medical Officer and ask for a free supply of DDT—the wonder-working substance which obliterates such pests as lice, fleas, flies and bugs. To get rid of head lice, apply DDT Emulsion to the head. To get rid of body lice, dust DDT Powder on the body and on the inside of all clothing. Sprinkle or shake the Powder on bedclothes, mattresses and furniture. In order to avoid infection, keep these rules in view: (1) Brush and comb the hair thoroughly at least once a day, and wash it regularly. (2) When going to bed, always change completely from day clothes. (3) Change underclothing at least once a week after washing, clothing should be ironed, special attention being given to the seams. If you become infested through contact with verminous persons, or if lice are detected in your dwelling, go at once to your local Medical Officer and ask for a free supply of DDT—the wonder-working substance which obliterates such pests as lice, fleas, flies and bugs. To get rid of head lice, apply DDT Emulsion to the head. To get rid of body lice, dust DDT Powder on the body and on the inside of all clothing. Sprinkle or shake the Powder on bedclothes, mattresses and furniture. Co-operate in this way in the good work of disinfection, and you will rid yourself and your household quickly of a dangerous pest. Issued by—Waterford County Council.
