FIANNA FAIL MEETING AT MOUNT STUART Speaking at a largely attended Fianna Fail meeting at Mount Stuart, Mr. S. Ormonde, T.D., said that the big increase in the Fianna Fail vote at the bye-election in East Donegal, West Cork and West Donegal, showed clearly that their Party would get an over-all majority at the forthcoming general election. Fianna Fail lost in West Donegal because of the big numbers who had emigrated since the present Government assumed office. As it was Fine Gael only barely won the seat and required the Clann na Poblachta transfers to do so. Clann na Poblachta was a finished Party and was fast becoming a laughing stock. It was now only the tail-end of Fine Gael and would disappear at the General Election. The Coalition were a government of broken promises. As in the past, every major decision made by Fine Gael proved wrong. The Government had promised to reduce the cost of living. Instead they had permitted a big rise. Instead of reducing taxation they had increased it by £2,000,000 with no resultant benefit to any section of the community. Unemployment and emigration were never supposed to stop emigration. In an effort to evade the issue they set up a commission twenty months ago. The Commission had not yet reported—it was all bluff and eyewash on the part of the Government and an effort to cloak their inefficiency. He was glad to see so many young people taking an interest in the movement. Mr. P. Burke who presided, thanked the members of the local cumann for their great work during the past year. The following officers were elected for the coming year:—President, Mr. P. Foley; Vice-President, Mr. M. Condon; Chairman, Mr. P. Burke; Vice-Chairman, Mr. P. Moloney; Treasurer, Messrs. Liam Meehan and David Foley. Hon. Sec., Mr. Tomas Meehan. A vote of sympathy was passed to Mr. C. Curran, Clashmore, on his recent bereavement. Mr. Ormonde also addressed another largely attended meeting of the Kieley's Cross F.F. Cumann.
