Kilbarry Bogs To Be Drained.

The City Manager (Mr. Liam Rafits) has written to landowner of the Kilbarry area stating that if a majority of them are not in favour of having the drainage of the Kilbarry bogs carried out under the Minister for Agriculture's reclamation scheme, the Waterford Corporation will arrange for compulsory acquisition.

The question of this drainage has been cropping up at intervals for years back. At one time it was suggested to convert the 600 acres of swamp into an aerodrome to service planes between Waterford and Britain; on another occasion it was suggested to turn the bog into a monster playing pitch, and so even held the view that it would provide ideal housing sites.

Medical authorities are of the opinion that in its present condition it is not conducive to good health.

It is understood that at a recent meeting of the owners of the swamp, it was decided to implement the Minister's scheme.

Poisoning of Farns Stock by Water Droppet.—Reports have reached the Department of Agriculture of the occurrence of deaths amongst cattle on pasture as a result of eating water droppet. This is a common weed of ditches and river banks, with a paralytic root and finely divided leaves resembling those of the carrot.

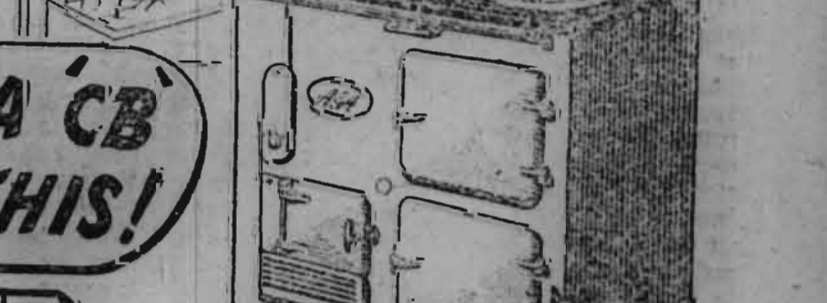
