DUNGARVAN CIRCUIT COURT

Opened in the Court-house, Dungarvan, on Tuesday last, before his Lordship Mr. Justice Roe, at 11 a.m. and was concluded at 1 p.m. a large number of the cases listed being announced as settled or adjourned in view of pending settlements asked for.

Payment out of Court.—Mr. Clarke, B.L., instructed by Messrs. J. F. Williams and Son, soirs, applied for and was granted payment out of funds lodged in Court on behalf of Patricia Martin, Abbotside, who was now reached the age of 21 years.

Similar application on behalf of Wm. C. Power, Grand Parade, Cork, was also granted. New Licence Issued.—Mr. Clarke, B.L., instructed by Messrs. J. F. Williams and Son, soirs, made application on behalf of Mr. John Curran, O'Connell Street, Dungarvan, for the issue of a new licence in respect of No. 8, O'Connell Street (already licensed) and the premises, No. 8, adjoining Mr. Thomas Walsh, B.E., proved a map of both premises.

Applicant, John Curran, said he was owner of No. 7, and became owner of No. 8 on 13th March, 1949, on a conveyance from his father. The valuation of No. 7 is £5 15s. 0d. and of No. 8, £12 10s. 0d. The existing shop is very small, and if the application is granted he intends enlarging the shop by including the present sitting and dining-rooms and the removal of the stairway.

Supt. O'Mahony said the Garda authorities did not object to the application which was then granted by his Lordship. Part of a Tobin.—Mr. Bacon, B.L., instructed by Mr. Kenny (Messrs. E. A. This particular account was kept running for years in the name of Thomas Tobin in the ledger, and some of the alleged stealing of a packet containing £3, the property of defendant, brother, Patrick. Defendants said they are indebted for the sum claimed.

Dungarvan Urban Council.

Mr. Thomas McCarthy, Chairman, presided at the meeting of the Dungarvan Urban Council, held on Friday last. Other members in attendance were Messrs. T. A. Kyne, T.D.; Michael Clancy, M. Kelly, and D. Sullivan. The manager, Mr. S. J. Moylan, and the chief assistant engineer, Mr. Ormonde, were also present.

Manager's Orders.—Arising out of orders made by the Manager since the previous meeting, Mr. Clancy was very pleased that the Manager had accepted the request of the members to reduce the charge for the use of the bathing boxes to school girls from 6d. to 2d.

Handball Club's Offer.—With regard to the deputation from the Dungarvan Handball Club, I am instructed by Messrs. Farrell & Morrissey, soirs, Dungarvan, to complete the juvenile alley now owned by the Council. The Council would probably lose that amount by way of grant, as Government money could not be used for the purpose of repayment. Under the Local Authorities (Gift Act, 1945), the Council could accept the money by way of a gift, subject to the Council's disposal of the same, but great care should be exercised in making such a grant.

Development of Site.—The letter from the U.D.C. stated that with regard to the Council's proposal to undertake the site by erecting a building, the opinion of the best course to adopt would be to invite public tenders for all sections of the site. With regard to the Council's request for a detailed estimate of the cost of carrying out the development by direct labour, the Chairman stated that this is a matter of course and unless tenders were obtained it would not be possible to say whether the scheme could be carried out more economically by direct labour or by contract. A competent direct-labour organisation already exists in Dungarvan, it is probable that the work could be carried out satisfactorily by direct labour.

Death of Rev. Francis O'Donoghue, O.S.A. The unexpected death of the Rev. Fr. Francis O'Donoghue, O.S.A., which occurred on Saturday at the Bon Secours Home, Cork, after a very brief illness, occasioned widespread regret not alone in his native Dungarvan but in every diocese where he ministered since his ordination in 1928. Aged 49, the late Fr. O'Donoghue was born at Knockmaun, Co. Kerry, and was educated at the Augustinian College, Dungarvan, and entered the novitiate of the Order of O.S.A. at Dublin in 1923. He studied in Rome from 1923 to 1928 and was ordained in the latter year. He returned to Ireland in 1928 and was assigned to St. Augustine's Church, Cork, where he remained until 1936, when he was appointed to St. Peter's, Cork. He served there until his death.
