## DUNGARVAN URBAN COUNCIL DISCUSSIONS

### Parking Regulations in Dungarvan

Mr. Lannon, Chairman, presided at the special meeting of the Urban Council on Friday last. Also present Messrs. N. Kelly, T. A. Kyme, T.D., P. O'Dwyer, T. Lee, Senator Butler, J. McCarthy, M. J. Keane and P. A. Casey. Supt. O'Mahony and Sgt. Liddane were present on the invitation of the Council to discuss parking regulations and speed limit of motors through the town.

### Town Hall Improvements Scheme

The first item discussed was the result from the deputations appointed at the last meeting to wait on Mr. Joseph Foley in connection with his town store in the Hall, as to whether he is prepared to evacuate the Hall to allow of improvements in accordance with the architects plan. Mr. Keane asked who was to go on the deputation.

### Speed Limit for Cars

Mr. Kyme welcomed Supt. O'Mahony and Sgt. Liddane who had come at the request of the Council to discuss the above and also the parking of cars in the town.

### Early Closing of Shops

The Council decided to appoint Messrs. Kyme, Butler, Keane, McCarthy and the Chairman to wait on Supt. O'Mahony on the following morning to ascertain if special orders were received from the Minister regarding the enforcement of the Early Closing of Shops Act in the town.

### Cheap Houses

Mr. Casey told the members that the Chairman and himself had succeeded in purchasing the five houses at Scrammins Lane at £30 per house. The price asked was £40 and the Engineers estimate was £33 per house.

### Parking of Cars

The Superintendent referring to the present system of parking at the Square, stated that having got the 'Barr' Manning's Office report, from the Council he sent two or three Guards to see what could be done on the lines suggested in the report. While some motorists fell in with the idea, others felt the Guards in no uncertain manner that they had no authority.
