DUNGARVAN URBAN COUNCIL

At last Friday night's meeting of the Urban Council Mr. N. Kelly, vice-chairman, and subsequently Mr. T. Lannon, chairman, presided. Other members in attendance were—Senator J. Butler, Messrs. T. McCarthy, T. Lee, P. O'Dwyer, T. A. Kyne, T.D.; M. J. Keane and P. A. Casey.

Town Hall Improvements.—In connection with the above the Clerk read a letter from the solicitor in which it was stated that it was not the proper procedure to serve notice to quit on Mr. Foley for possession of the portion of the premises known as the plucking store, and stating notice should be served for possession of the whole premises in the first instance.

Loan of £16,800.—On the proposal of Senator Butler, seconded by Mr. Kyne, the council approved the seeking of a loan of £16,800 for the Galway Housing Scheme already approved by the council.

Housing Tenders.—At this meeting the Chairman (Mr. T. Lannon) arrived and took the chair. The Clerk read the report of Mr. J. Ormond, B.E., on the housing meeting held on the 27th inst. and effected by doing the houses by direct labour as against the lowest tender of £26,699.

The report stated that the lowest tender, representing roughly £1,036 per house, was a very high price, and after consideration he is satisfied that direct labour system could not compete with it. He also maintained that it would not be possible to complete the scheme under 20 months by direct labour. That is four months longer than the time allowed Mr. O'Mahony.

Answering Mr. McCarthy, the Clerk stated there is a clause in the specification governing the employment of local labour.

(Mr. McCarthy)—Is there anything about the employment of workmen. He held that local key-men should also be appointed. He also held we could have a better house built by direct labour, but he hoped the council are unanimous in insisting on local labour.

Mr. O'Dwyer—While we would all favour direct labour, I am afraid we could not compete with the contractor. The houses will therefore be cheaper and that is what we should look for. Many of the Abbotside tenants are not able to meet the rents and are getting out.

Mr. Keane—Mr. O'Dwyer has struck the right note. Let us try to get the lowest possible rent and right tenants. How do you suggest we do this, Mr. O'Dwyer?

Mr. O'Dwyer—Obviously the acceptance of the lowest tender is the right way to keep the rents low. Mr. Keane—Yes, the tender has been accepted and the council have nothing further to do. The matter is out of our hands now and let the public know that.

Mr. Casey asked if the council are building the right type of house. He expressed his opinion that the council are embarking on a scheme of houses for which they won't have any tenants in three years' time, and asked what is the estimated rents of the scheme.

Clerk—That is not yet worked out. Mr. Casey—That is the first thing we should consider. The rent is the all-important point. Can the people we are building afford to pay it? Are the council satisfied they can get 66 tenants who can afford to occupy the houses?

Replying to Mr. Casey—the Clerk said the rents of the Abbotside houses were 6/3, 7/6 and 11/0 plus rates per week. Mr. Casey—Will the same rents be applicable at Galloys hill? He suggested those rents are very high. He also said he completely disagreed with the layout of the kitchens in the Abbotside scheme. What he would like to know before they approve of the loan of £16,800

Late Mcc. O'Flynn

It was with a deep sense of shock and sincere regret that the people of Dungarvan and the County Waterford generally learned of the death, which took place suddenly on Sunday night of Mr. Maurice O'Flynn, Newsagent, The Square, Dungarvan. Widely and extremely popular with all classes, the late Maurice O'Flynn had an expansive circle of friends, which, due to his pleasant disposition, his genial, unassuming and kindly manner, was being daily added to. An exemplary Catholic and devoted husband and an indulgent and loving father, his loss to his wife and family is irreparable, and to whom the sincere sympathy of all goes out in their great sorrow.

The deep and widespread sympathy evoked by his unexpected death was fully demonstrated by the immense cortege of mourners and friends that attended the removal of the remains to the Parish Church, Dungarvan, on Monday evening. The huge crowd, representative of every home in the town and county for miles around was augmented by close on 100 pupils of St. Augustine's College marching four deep. The cortege was preceded to the church by Rev. W. Halahan, C.C., Cathedral, Waterford; Rev. Fr. C. Ballinamela; Very Rev. Fr. Cummins, Prior, O.S.A.; Rev. Fr. Hartnett, O.S.A.; Rev. Fr. Nugent, Rockhampton, Australia; Rev. Fr. Lannan, Waterford, where the coffin was awaited by Very Rev. Fr. O'Connell, who blessed the remains and read the prayers for the dead.
