ABATEMENT OF RATES ON AGRICULTURAL LAND.

EMPLOYMENT ALLOWANCE.

NOTICE is hereby given that in Forms on which claims for Abatement of Rates in respect of Agricultural Land (over 70 years of age) at work during the whole of the year, 1950, have been issued to every rated occupier of land whose holding (or combined holdings) in the County Health District exceeds £20 a year rateable valuation.

An Employment Allowance by way of Abatement of Rates will not be allowed in the financial year commencing on the 1st April, 1951, unless a Claim is made on the Form provided by the Council.

Every occupier who makes a Claim will receive an acknowledgment of receipt of claim. If no acknowledgment is received in due course, a notification should be sent to the undersigned.

A false return, made with a view to obtaining an abatement of rates, is a criminal offence liable to prosecution.

Experimental work on improvement of hill grazing is proceeding; the reclamation of estuarine marsh land will later be the subject of expert examination. (2) FERTILISATION i.e. testing of soil at 1/- per acre, supply of required quantities of lime, phosphates and potash on payment of a minimum of 10% in cash and balance by addition to Land Purchase Annuity. (3) DRAINAGE AND RECLAMATION MACHINERY i.e. grants and loans towards the purchase of specialised equipment such as bulldozers, excavators, drainage ploughs and power units.
