What are our chances on next Sunday? DOUBLE G.A.A. PROGRAMME AT DUNGARVAN

Deise supporters in their thousands will flock to the Rebel City on Sunday next to cheer on the senior hurlers who meet Tipperary in the first round of the Munster Senior Hurling Championships. The Waterford team selected is only fairly well received and the inclusion of J. Kiely (Eire Oge) and W. Dooney (Tourin) are the two big surprises of the line out and one wonders were the selectors wise in relegating to the reserves, Johnny O'Connor, M. McHugh (St. Augustine's) and Phil Grimes (Mt. Sion). The latter three are tried and true with plenty of experience and hurling ability. Undoubtedly John Kiely is playing great hurling just now and if he reproduces the form shown in recent games he could be the man of the match. Club hurling and inter-county hurling are, however, two different things and it will be interesting to see how he fares out on Sunday on this his first big occasion. Dooney (Tourin) on the other hand, is quite an unknown quantity and it is beyond me how the selection committee passed over Phil Grimes in favour of the Tourin man who has experience of an inter-county nature. Seemingly his club, Tourin, was the deciding factor, and let us hope the selectors know their job when selecting him for the big occasion.

Regan, Fanning, Walsh, Hayes, Quessly and Goode are capable of holding their men in any emergency. Kiely will have his big test at centrefield and indeed some fierce drives in the first half and in the second round when Dungarvan asserted their superiority, he saved shots from all angles. K. O'Connor will add extra weight to the half-line of attack but I am of the opinion it was an unwise move to play M. Flannery in the centre-ground because that he is in the position, more avoirdupois, in my opinion is needed. M. O'Connor gave some grand displays in the National Hurling League and if the present fine weather holds I expect him to be elusive and fast on the Cork pitch which should suit his style of play.

Willy Galvin, Jim Fives and John Keane complete the team. The former was on the reserves last year; his recall, in some quarters, came as a surprise, but it should not be forgotten he is capable of doing better than least expected. Lt. Jim Fives, spearhead of the attack, is one of our most improved players. He has height, reach and plenty of hurling and I expect him to be a real thorn in the side of the Tipp defence. John Keane (he is finished) is in the left corner and the majority of supporters do not agree with his selection. John Keane has a good score sheet on Sunday.

The absence of Vin Baston and Tom Fives is a serious setback to our chances but most of the team are young, and once again let us air the familiar cry—Give your chance; give them more than a chance; follow them with confidence and give them your full vocal support. Tipp, undoubtedly are favourites. Possession is nine points of the law, but what is it but a game and let our boys remember until the final whistle. Best luck to Waterford. Few gave our hurlers a chance in 1948 and would not come as a surprise to me to witness a Waterford win on Sunday.

Our junior footballers gave a great all-round display when winning well from Clare at Lisycross in the first round but on Sunday they will be meeting Cork who accounted for Tipperary, far sterner opposition. The team shows few changes from that which won at Lisimore—J. Murphy (Lisimore) comes out at right half-back and the Dungarvan pair, Barry and Curran should have a good understanding in the right place. Due to the playing of Kiely (Eire Oge) on the left, the left corner forward position is vacant but I hear that Star Kavanagh who played a star game for Old Parish on Sunday last is now included on the selected panel. He may not be the left corner forward position but his display against Kilsrossanty entitles him to a place on the line out.

Our footballers are good enough to win and I place my confidence in them to give a good lead to the hurlers.
