Waterford Board of Assistance

Mr. T. Gallagher, vice-chairman, presided at the monthly meeting of the above on Monday last. Also present—Senator J. Butler, Messrs. Wm. Kennelly, P. Browne, N. Kelly and R. Barrett. Mr. J. K. O'Hare, Secretary, and Mrs. P. Croke, Assistant Secretary, were also present.
WATERFORD DISPENSARY.
The Engineer reported the suggested site for a new dispensary at Ballyne Lane, Waterford, as suitable, and the board made an order to open negotiations with the owners, the Waterford Corporation.
EXCESS EXPENDITURE.
The board voted excess expenditure of £5,000 required for the purpose of rickling and storing turf at the board's institutions, which the Secretary said would cost approximately £1 per ton. Senator Butler asked if this included the hatching of the ricks, as he held it was very necessary. The Secretary said the hatching was included. A further sum for repairs to the institutions was passed by the board.
EXPENSES TO MIDWIVES.
A letter from the Department of Health stated that the board's resolution calling for an expense allowance for midwives was at present under consideration and the Minister's decision would be conveyed as soon as possible.

Meeting of County Dungarvan District Committee of Agriculture

"The attitude of the Department seems to be one of boycott on the production of food and fruit by members of County Committees of Agriculture," said Mr. M. Harty at a meeting of Waterford County Committee of Agriculture, when he proposed that a letter from the Department refusing to allow members to participate in an apple growing scheme, should be returned to the Minister for his reconsideration. Mr. P. R. Power, chairman, presided at the meeting. The letter from the Department said the Minister was not prepared to accord his consent to the participation by members of the committee in the scheme towards the planting of apple trees in the county. The Minister pointed out that should members be permitted to participate in the scheme it would then be open to grave objection. Mr. Hesklin said that while the Minister was a very good one, there was also the point worth considering that while such restrictions exist they will be the cause of keeping many men who would be of valuable assistance to the committee of that committee. Mr. Harty's proposal to send the letter back to the Department for the Minister's reconsideration was unanimously carried, and it was suggested that the Minister should waive the restriction in this case in the same way as had been done in the lime subsidy scheme. The committee approved of a proposal from the Department that 15 per cent. increase be granted on the portion of remuneration being paid to officers of the committee in excess of £200, and 15 per cent. to all those on the portion up to £200. A subsidy of £10 was approved for payment to the Waterford Show Committee. The committee congratulated Mr. Liam Ryan, of Tallow, on his success in competing in the 100 Yards race at the County Agricultural Show in Dungarvan. Mr. J. Dempsey, Shandon, charged three young boys—Patrick Roche, James Walsh and James Kelly with the larceny of 17 apples each. Mr. Morrissey, socr. (Messrs. Farrer and Morrissey) for complainant. Mr. C. WATERFORD COUNTY COUNCIL STRIKING OF RATE AGAIN ADJOURNED

When the question of making the rate for 1951/52 again came before a special meeting of the Waterford Co. Council in Dungarvan on Friday last, there was a surprise development when the Chairman (Mr. D. Leahy) proposed that the matter be discussed in camera. He said there were a number of items in connection with the matter which he would like to have discussed in committee. Mr. T. A. Kyne, T.D., stated it has always been his policy to let the public know the full facts of all public affairs and was not in favour of discussing matters in committee. However, in this case he did appreciate that there might be some good reason for discussing the matter in camera, but before agreeing to it he would like to know what that reason was. The Chairman replied that he had a suggestion to make which, if agreed to by the council members, might be the cause of avoiding litigation. He wished to have the public know about it unless they approved of it as it might be raising false hopes. A letter from the Department of Local Government was read as follows: "Dated 14/8/51. To the County Manager, Dear Mr. Morrissey: As promised in my letter of the 27th ult., regarding the raising of certain sanitary expenses of Waterford County Council, the Minister has now taken the opinion of the present Attorney-General, and having regard to the terms of the Statute, the Minister is in a position to add anything to the Department's official letter of the 10th May last and previous correspondence. The council has now into committee and after a discussion lasting one hour and a half has passed the following resolution: 'That a joint deputation made up of the Chairman, Deputy Chairman and Senator Butler, for the County Council, and the Tramway Clerk, with Mr. E. Power and Mr. Morrissey, as Town Commissioners, await on the Minister for Local Government to request him to introduce legislation to clarify the meaning of Section 50 of the Local Government Sanitary Services Act, 1948, in view of the conflicting opinion of eminent Senior Counsel, and that the County Manager and Council's Solicitor be available when the deputation attends on the Minister, and that the County Council adjourn the making of the rate for 1951/52 to a meeting to be convened by the Chairman.' BALLYDUFF (UPPER) WATER SUPPLY Following Ballyduff's (County Waterford) urgent appeal for a supply of pure water to meet the needs of the village, Waterford County Council at a special meeting held in Dungarvan approved of an emergency scheme which would provide the village with water pending the carrying out of a major scheme which is at present in the course of preparation. At the last meeting of the council a deputation made up of residents of the area came before the meeting and put up a very strong case. It was decided on by the Ballyduff Parish Council, based on the feelings of the people, that the present water supply would never be satisfactory, and that a new supply would have to be provided. It was pointed out that the present water supply, even after re-lining the filter bed, was cloudy, dirty and repugnant, and that the water made by a U.C.C. pathologist showed that Dr. O'Neill's test was correct and that the water at present being used in the village is poisonous. The Parish Council stated that the people of the village could never feel assured that the poison could be fully removed by filtering and this attitude is strengthened by the local M.C.C., especially since water continues to look dirty and tastes badly. At the moment the people refuse to use the water for human consumption and for drinking water they have to travel a half mile. It was also stated by the Parish Council that the only samples taken to date have shown that the water is safe. The only tests reported to the Parish Council were those made by Dr. O'Neill and the U.C.C. pathologist, and these showed that the water was nothing less than bacterial poison. These have always been the Parish Council's belief and they have been and are being treated unfairly. The Parish Council also stated that since the beginning of the year a four-year-old child in the village has been diagnosed as suffering from gastro-enteritis caused by drinking tap water and that the people of Ballyduff unanimously demand some immediate emergency action at the same time being requested to play their part in providing an emergency supply.
