## SENIOR HURLING COUNTY FINAL Dungarvan or Mt. Sion for County Honours ATTRACTIVE MINOR CURTAIN RAISER

Dungarvan the Venue  
Thoughts of next Sunday's Senior Hurling Final takes me back to 1941, the year in which Dungarvan won their last Senior Hurling title. A span of ten years has elapsed since that famous game at Lismore. Dungarvan then were the equal of any individual team in the county. In the meantime, the club have had a lean period, and it is a welcome sign to once again see them in the county decider lined up against their rivals at Clon Sion. The Blues to date have won six titles—1938, 1947, 1929, 1922, 1925 and 1941. They will make a strong bid on Sunday next to equal Mount Sion's record, who have seven—1938, 1939, 1940, 1943, 1945, 1948, 1949. Mount Sion undoubtedly have the more imposing record and their displays to date in the current championship places them as favourites to regain the laurels which was so surprisingly taken from them last year by Tourin. Dungarvan on the other hand are great championship fighters, and they by no means are to be underestimated when it comes to the County Final. Mount Sion were far superior in the first round and gave a grand all-round display of speed, skill and craft. They swung the ball around a good deal and their motto is, 'The ball can do the work provided it is handled properly.' From Jimmy Regan in goal to Kennedy full forward the team is a well-balanced one, and when in form will take a great team to beat them. On the other hand, Dungarvan pick they play first-class hurling, and it will take a fit team to match them in the finer points of the game. In their second outing they accounted for Cappoquin. The game in the first half was a close affair and some brilliant hurling was witnessed. As a matter of fact it was out of the book and far above any display of recent years in county hurling. Mount Sion, however, pulled out at the second period and won by a substantial margin. The score, however, was no indication of the play, and, in my opinion, they owe their victory over Cappoquin to goal Johnny Regan, who was in devastating form on the day in question.

they won well but by no means  
impressive, and in their second  
round match against Avonbeg  
although victorious, the team  
showed several positional weak-  
nesses. The final game is a  
local affair of another colour, and  
Dungarvan, amonged some
