NOTICE is hereby given to the general public

that it is urgently necessary to ensure continuous measures for the destruction of Rats and Mice in Waterford County Health District. Much destruction is caused annually to fustoots by Rats and Mice, and these pests are also responsible for the spread of many diseases. Measures recommended for their destruction should be carried out as follows, viz.—Trapping can be successfully adopted in many cases and some practical method. Where poisoning is resorted to, it must be carefully practised, the bait being so laid that it will not be accessible to fowl or domestic animals, and notices being erected in places where the baits are laid warning people to keep dogs and other animals away. These places should be carefully inspected and visited regularly and the baits destroyed if not successful within a short period. The poisons recommended for use in preparing the baits are generally red squill and barium carbonate. Red Squill should be fresh, as it loses its potency after some time. Barium Carbonate powder can be obtained but orders therefor should be given at an early date as stocks of this commodity are not usually held in this district. The following recipes containing that poison have been recommended as being easy to prepare and effective in use—1. Barium Carbonate Powder (Parts by weight)—1. Rolled Oats (Parts by weight)—2. Dripping (Parts by weight)—1. Melt the fat and make all ingredients into a thick paste but in Summer use rather less fat). 2. Barium Carbonate Powder (Parts by weight)—1. Fine Oatmeal (Parts by weight)—2. Castor Sugar (Parts by weight)—1. The bait can be laid in twists of tissue paper and will be of additional attraction if flavoured with animal oil. When using these baits it is well to distribute them liberally at the first application, and to lay at least ten times as many baits as the number rats estimated to be present. It will be well to vary the form and appearance of the baits at intervals. It should be recommended that strong poisons such as Thallium Sulphate, Arsenic or Phosphorus should be used, in view of the danger to domestic animals or poultry.

It is desirable that farmers should co-operate to the fullest extent possible in exterminating rats.

During the operations, it is suggested that each stack or rick before the threshing machine arrive and while being threshed should be surrounded by a rat-proof fence of wire netting 4 feet in height, slightly sloping inwards, and at a sufficient distance from the rick to prevent rats jumping over it from the rick. The rats can be killed within the enclosure by dogs or by sticks. Mice may be readily caught in traps baited with fat bacon. Barium Carbonate may also be used with suitable precautions. By Order, S.
