Dungarvan District Court

Held on Wednesday before Mr. Justice O'Riain.

Occasional Licenses.—Mr. Williams, solr., was granted occasional licenses on behalf of Mr. Nicholas Casey Square, in connection with the Dungarvan Annual Courting granted at Clonsilla on 1st and 2nd January, 1952.

Renewal of License.—Mr. Lanigan, solr., was granted a renewal of the license attached to the Dungarvan Golf Club.

Dance License.—Mr. Williams, solr., on behalf of Mr. E. Deary, Town Clerk, applied for a renewal of the dance license attached to the Town Hall, Dungarvan, and stated that the County Medical Officer of Health and the Fire Preventative Officer had approved the plans now before the Department for sanction.

Mr. Deary detailed the steps taken. The Department turned down the previous plan forwarded to them. Another plan was then prepared by the architect which meets the requirements of the Co. Medical Officer of Health and Fire Officer and embraces the first stage in the maximum improvements.

Mr. Williams suggested that the Justice renew the license for short dances for the year.

Replying to the Justice, the Superintendent said he had no objection to short dances.

The Justice then granted the renewal of the license for short dances only and fixed the maximum number to be allowed at such dances at 400 people. He said the whole question can be gone into again at the next Licensing Sessions.

O.S.M. Bailroom.—Mr. Williams said the question of the dance license for this hall was under consideration. The Justice made a suggestion that the previous court that the Fire Officer meet Mr. Stephenson with a view to discussing a separate exit from the bar attached to the dance hall.

DUNGARVAN TAKE MINOR HURLING HONOURS

MOUNT SION (HOLDERS) FAIL.

The Dungarvan Minor hurlers were defeated in a very close struggle, in wrestling the County Minor Championship from Mt. Sion (holders) after 70 minutes of grand hurling at the Gaelic Field, Dungarvan, on Sunday.

The winners led by 2-3 to 0-1 at the interval, but a great revival by Mt. Sion in the second half reduced the arrears to 1 point, leaving the full-time score: Dungarvan, 3-3; Mt. Sion 2-5. The winners forwards, who were on the left side, missed many chances, particularly in the second half, as they had a great revival from midfield, where Veale was outstanding, ably assisted by Kenneally and M. Fitzgerald. The latter, however, had given far better displays in previous matches. Conroy, Shalloe and Kirby were sound defenders for the winner, while Querry brought off some good saves, the two goals that beat him being scored from a ruck of players in the square. Spratt and Hayes were best in the forward line, with Harris trying all the way against much heavier opponents. Teehan was the outstanding player on the losers' team, who were an evenly balanced bunch of well-trained, hard-hitting hurlers. He had ably assistance from Holden, Begadon, while McBride in goal kept the challengers score at 3 goals, having many brilliant saves to his credit.

DUNGARVAN URBAN COUNCIL

There was a long discussion on the manner in which people were ill-treating the Spring well on the outskirts of the town at the fortnightly meeting of the Urban Council on Sunday.

Mr. T. Lennon, chairman, presided. The matter was raised by Mr. T. Lee, who stated that despite their statements at a previous meeting, some people continued to make use of the well for washing their motor cars. He said that this was not right in view of the fact that a great many people depended on this well for their supply of water.

Mr. Lee commented on a recent job done on the surroundings of the well by the County Council, and said that the job was badly done and might as well not have been bothered with at all.

In reply to a member, Mr. Lee said that he had caught a person using the well for the purpose of washing his car, and when he challenged him about it, the person replied that he would defy him (Mr. Lee) and his fellows. "I want to make it very clear here to-night," said Mr. Lee, "that I am directed by the people of my area for the people and for the people I will stand up. I am not a mouth-piece for anyone and I am not using any man's brains but my own and if this council will not take immediate action to put a stop to this kind of disgraceful conduct, then I will take the matter to higher authorities, across Abbeyside to the Old Schoolhouse. Railway lines would be laid along the quay for the loading and unloading of vessels."

After further discussion it was agreed that the attending of the council would visit the well and see what can be done in the matter.

Mr. O'Dwyer raised a question in connection with St. Bridget's well, and it was agreed to have the matter investigated. The complaining party was supplied with water there at present so poor that it would take hours to fill a bucket.

When a list of local clubs accepted for registration in the purpose of letting of the Town Hall was placed before the meeting, the Chairman questioned the registration of a club under the title West Waterford Constabulary Council Labour Party. He said that he had been given the impression that the local clubs were to be accepted for registration. If that was the case, they did not think that this was a social club as it would appear to cover the entire county. He suggested that it would be better for them to accept only clubs in the town.

Mr. T. McCarthy said that there should be no objection to any political Party using the hall. He argued with the Chairman for a considerable period on the matter, pointing out that the hall referred to was a local one as it was centred in Dungarvan where all meetings were held and where all business was transacted.

After further discussion it was agreed to adjourn the matter for a better attendance.

Dungarvan Town Hall was once again on the agenda, but on this occasion was a very brief one.

The Clerk stated that a plan which provided for the carrying out of the repairs without necessitating the removal of Mr. Foley's 100 store had been drawn up and had been sent to the Department of Local Government for their consideration. An application would again be made for the renewal of the dance license at the next District Court. In the meantime there was nothing the council could do in the matter.

Dealing with the supplementary grants for housing, the Clerk stated that further to the council's decision, all applicants had been written to and the majority of them were willing to meet the council's wishes and pay their rates at once—that is to forego the seven years' remission.

Mr. Casey suggested that the entire matter should now be referred to the council's solicitor.

This was agreed to.

A reduction of rents, which was passed at a previous meeting of the council but which was to be raised at this meeting, was adjourned.

Inquest on Stradbally Man

BODY FOUND IN STREAM.

A verdict in accordance with the medical evidence that death was due to asphyxia from drowning was returned at an inquest held in Stradbally, Co. Waterford, on Saturday morning on Jas. Higgins, a County Council road ganger, whose body was found on Friday morning of last week in a stream near Five Mile Crossroads, Stradbally.

Mr. Thos. Kiersey, solr., Asst. Coroner for East Waterford, sitting with a jury, in announcing the verdict, added that there was no evidence to show how deceased got into the water.

Supt. J. Lyons, Tramore, represented the Garda.

Miss Nora Higgins sister of the deceased, gave evidence of identification. She said that her brother, who was single and aged 51, had been a road ganger for many years. She last saw him alive on the 23rd inst. at 7.45 a.m. He was then on his way to work. To her knowledge he had not been attending a doctor for some years and she thought he had no worries.

Mr. John Wall, Stradbally, who worked as slipperer, and who saw the body in the stream where it was found and formed the opinion that he could have fallen in at that spot. There was two feet of water there.

Sergt. A. O'Connor said that he went to Curraghmore Bridge, where the body of James Higgins was pointed out to him. The body was lying in the stream and was fully clothed. Deceased's overcoat was caught in a tree, which was diagonally across the stream, and it was drawn up around his shoulders. The bank was slippery, and when they took the body from the water grass and weeds were clasped in one hand. Deceased's shirt was found on the 21st.

Witness stated that if the body had fallen in the water at the bridge it could have floated down to the spot where it was found.

Dr. C. A. Quinn said that he had examined the body on the 23rd and would say that death had taken place 48 hours previously. He made a post mortem examination and found no marks of violence. Death was due to asphyxia from drowning and his findings, he said, would be consistent with deceased falling into the river accidentally.

Waterford Lack Shooting Forwards.

LAOIS WELL TESTED.

Laois added further points to their tally in the National Football League when they defeated Waterford at Dungarvan on Sunday by 4 goals 3 points to 3 goals 2 points. Local weather conditions favoured the occasion but the attendance was poor. Despite a long period of rain over the past few weeks the condition of the pitch was much better than what was expected and certainly did not influence the play to any great extent.

Waterford played well after a slow start and for a while in the first half it seemed that they would pull off the hoped-for surprise. They marked their opponents well but failed badly in their attempts to register. Laois made use of every effort to break through. Critchley and O'Rourke availed of every opportunity that came their way and Critchley deserves the credit for Laois' victory. He scored their four goals.
