Annual Training—Members from Dungarvan are reporting to Collins Barracks, Cork, on Saturday for 14 days training. The next period of full time training commences on the 14th May, 1955. Members who intend to undergo this period should hand in their names as soon as possible.

Annual Range Practices—On Sunday next the 1st May, 1955. Yougal Open Range is at the disposal of this unit for the purpose of firing 300 in annual range practices. It is hoped that attendance will be in comparison with previous Sundays. Transport will leave Battalion Headquarters, Yougal Road, at 11.45 hours and collect personnel at Arlish at 12.00 and Clashmore at 12.30 hours.

Deputy Ormonde
in the Dail**

At question time in the Dail Deputy Ormonde asked the Minister for Industry and Commerce whether in view of the fact that the Tramore Town Commissioners have now secured suitable premises, he will make representations to Bord Fáilte aforesaid to establish a tourist information bureau in that town.

The reply of the Minister was: Under the Tourist Traffic Act 1952, the function of establishing, equipping and operating Tourist Information Bureaux is assigned to Fógra Fáilte and I do not interfere in the discharge by Fógra Fáilte of its responsibilities in this matter.

He asked the Minister for Industry and Commerce if he will ascertain from Coras Iompair Eireann why interview boards are considered necessary for the selection of candidates for appointment to clerical posts in that organisation, in view of the fact that such interviews are not considered necessary for appointments to similar posts in the Civil Service, and if he will make representations to the board to dispense with such interviews in future.

The Minister replied—Under the Transport Act, 1950, the Board of Coras Iompair Eireann are empowered to make their own rules in connection with the appointments for range practices on Sunday next.

Dangerous driving charge dismissed

Youghal District Court

At Youghal District Court, Before District Justice W. P. Cahill.

Mr. G. Y. Goldberg—On behalf of the members of the profession in Cork, I would like to associate myself with this expression of sympathy by Mr. Keane to Mr. Macnamara on the death of his wife. The death of Mrs. Macnamara was of personal concern to me, said Mr. Goldberg, as she and I were in U.C.P. at the same time and in Dublin. I can only hope and pray that Almighty God will help them to bear this heavy blow.

Messrs. Jerome Rosayne, St. Clair Rice, Supt. Sean Hughes, B.L., and M. Hennessy, Court Clerk, joined in the expression of sympathy.

District Justice—For myself personally I was shocked when I heard of the death of Mrs. Macnamara and I desire to associate myself with this expression of sympathy. Death at any time is a shock but death coming like this, to a lady in the prime of life, is still more poignant. Mrs. Macnamara was held in very high esteem. I think Mr. Macnamara even regretted that everyone who knew him and knew his wife would have nothing but sincere sympathy for him in his bereavement. 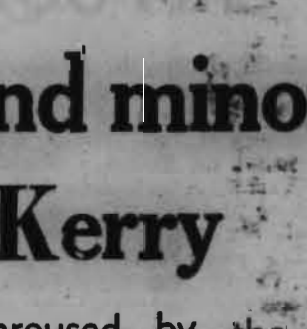
