Colrs. Protest -

"No Hope for Locals"

A strong protest was lodged by Dungarvan Urban Council against the employment of outside contractors and labourers while many of the townsmen remained idle.

There are men coming in from all over the county, they are given grants to build houses while we have no work for our own townsmen at the street corners and a hope of a job."

Mr. Lee went on to state that the contractors were being brought into buildings for which the money was not available. Some of these contractors, he stated, were not allowed to have their wages and were able to do the work at a cost less than those complying with the regulations.

He could not understand why the engineers passed the work being carried out by such men. But no matter what kind of work we give grants towards what they are building. We are actually encouraging them to come in while we are driving our townsmen out of their town and out of their country. We have contractors in this town who are paying big rates here but they cannot get work to do."

The Chairman, Ald. Tom Kyne, I.D., said that it was not necessary to be a trade union worker to comply with the Act governing the grants but trade union rates of pay should be paid the workers. If it could be proved that they were not being paid the council could take action. The Chairman went on to say that any Irish national was entitled to work anywhere in his own country and there was no power there to interfere with the rights of a private person and he did not think it would be desirable that such power should be in existence.

Deputy Kenneally said the official in question had done a lot of work under the Health Act.

BOARD OF PUBLIC ASSISTANCE

Loans amounting to £21,200 to be Sought

Mr. Dick Barron, Chairman, presided at the monthly meeting of the Board of Assistance in Dungarvan on Monday; other members in attendance were Deputies Kyne and Kenneally, Messrs. D. Fitzpatrick (Mayor of Waterford), Tom Gallagher, Wm. Carroll, Thos. Lannon and C. Curran.

AN INCREASE OR GRATUITY
Arising from the minutes of the previous meeting Mr. Lannon referred to the fact that in July 1957 a resolution was passed by this Board granting an increase of salary to an official of the Board and a sum of over £400 was paid out. At the Co. Council estimates meeting he raised this matter again and was informed by the Co. Manager that it was not an increase of salary but a gratuity was paid the officer.

The Acting Secretary (Mr. S. Glanville) said it was a gratuity that was paid.
Mr. Lannon - It was an increase was passed by the majority of this Board. It seems to me continued Mr. Lannon that the official side of this Board are very anxious to give away public money.

The Acting Secretary at this stage read a letter from the Department dated October 1957 in which the Minister refused to grant an increase of salary but was prepared to sanction granting a gratuity.

Mr. Lannon referring to the present position throughout the country with unemployment and said it is no wonder there are cattle in the pound in Waterford to-day as the unfortunate farmers who own them cannot pay their rates.

Deputy Kenneally said the official in question had done a lot of work under the Health Act.

£21,200 were passed subject to sanction.

CLASHMORE DISPENSARY RESIDENCE
Mr. Curran asked if there is any progress being made regarding the Clashmore dispensary residence.

The Acting Secretary read two reports from the Architect, one estimating the cost of building a house which would comply with the Department's requirements at £4,500 and the other, building a house to the dimensions of the one offered to the Board, at £3,000.

Mr. Carroll - Could we bring this matter any nearer to a head by proposing to buy this house which is offered to us, subject to sanction of the Department. He then went on to refer to the cost of the county of architects and said he knows in one big country they never employ an architect. All plans are drawn by their own engineers. We here are asking after big empires, we have plenty of engineers who can draw plans, which they did in the building of their own homes. They did not employ architects.

Mr. Curran said if he thought the building of a new house would only cost as much as the house offered or even a little more he would favour building. He had told the owner of the offered house the same thing. The Minister, continued Mr. Curran, is well aware of the urgency in the Clashmore case.

Mr. Lannon proposed an amendment that it not be purchased, but got no seconder and the resolution was declared passed.

NFA MEETING WITH THE TAOISEACH The dairying industry in Ireland has just received a just price for its products.

Last Thursday March 13th, the Taoiseach and the Minister for Agriculture met the President and the four vice-presidents of the NFA. The NFA deputation was accompanied by the General Secretary, the Economic Advisors and the Secretaries of the Grain, Pigs and Milk Committees. The deputation met before the Taoiseach and the Minister, a memorandum on the agriculture industry. This memo set out various aspects of the present position with particular reference to the uncertainty of Government policy on agriculture. It gave a detailed account of the effects that reduced output, rising costs and reduced subsidies would have on farmers.

Under these circumstances, it would seem reasonable that she should pay an economic price for Irish butter and dairy products.
