Late Captain Maurice Daly Fermoy WATERFORD COUNTY COUNCIL

Mr. M. Morrissey presided at a meeting of the above in Dungarvan on Monday week last, other members in attendance were Deputies Kyne and Kennelly, Messrs. J. Butler, P. Butler, J. Power, H. Dowd, W. Dower, C. Curran, N. Walsh, S. Lynch, J. Fahy, K. O'Ryan, R. Barron, J. Quirke, D. Montayne, W. Foran, D. Heskin, J. Flynn and M. Hartly.

Co-opted. Mr. F. Roche a former member of the council for the Kilmacthomas Division was unanimously co-opted to fill the vacancy on the Council caused by the resignation of Deputy Sean Ormonde on his appointment as Minister for Posts and Telegraphs. The co-optation was proposed by Mr. J. Quirke and seconded by Mr. J. Power.

Deputy Kyne its only fair that a member of the party should be appointed.

WATER SUPPLIES.
Mount Bolton, Portlaoine.
The Engineers estimate for a piped supply of water to the above in lieu of a pump was £283. The estimate given for the pump in 1952 being £270.

Mr. Foran—This is an alarming figure for a small job, to the ordinary layman. I don't know how the Engineer arrived at this figure. The Engineer pointed out to him that there might be slight contamination but I completely disagree with this figure.

With regard to the pump Mr. Foran said he had seen too many failures and this pump is another failure we will be going perhaps 100 yards and sinking another. He would propose that we approve the expenditure for a piped supply subject to sanction of the Department. This was seconded by Mr. Lynch and passed.

EXTENSION TO DEERPARK, LISMORE.
On the proposal of Mr. Dowd seconded by Mr. Heskin it was agreed to approve the borrowing from the Local Loans Fund of a sum not exceeding £2,000 for the above extension from the Cappoquin Lismore supply. The proposal was passed.

EXTRA LIGHTS.
The Council considered the erection of an extra light at (1) Castle Avenue, Lismore at cost of £38, plus £5.8.0. for annual charge (2) Ballyduff Kilmeeven £22 plus 15/- annual charge (3) 5 lights at Aglish cost of erection £33 plus up keep £215. 3 lights at Villierstown £40 plus £25.0.

Mr. Quirke asked why the difference in the cost of upkeep between the Lismore one £5.8.0. and the others about 15/-.

Mr. Heskin This should be a flat rate.

Deputy Kennelly asked for an explanation.

The Council decided to reduce the number of lamps at Aglish to 3, one at the church, one at Hallahans and the other at the bridge and two at Villierstown

REPORT ADOPTED

On the proposal of Deputy Kennelly seconded by Deputy Kyne the auditors report was adopted.

TALLOW SANITARY CONVENTION

When the question of acquiring a site by compulsion at Tallow was debated it was stated the reason it was being acquired by compulsion was to establish title. When Mr. Dower said he heard that the people of Tallow did not want this.

Mr. Quirke suggested adjourning the matter and arrange a meeting of the residents of Tallow to get their views. The Co. Council members for the area to attend.

ARRKEEN VISITORS.

The Council appointed Messrs. Quirke, Lynch and Flynn as visitors to Arkeeen for July, and Messrs Dower, Dowd, Lannon and Curran for August.

FIOR GAELTACHT AREA.

Mr. Curran proposed and Mr. Dower seconded a resolution to the Minister asking that Ardmore, Grange, Mountstart, Montra be recognised as Fior Gaeltacht Areas.

EXTRA DUTIES.

A sum of £20 was passed on the proposal of the Chairman seconded by Mr. Montayne as extra remuneration to Mr. Casey for his work in connection with the administration of the Council bylaws at Tramore.

SPEEDING ON ARDMORE STRAND.

A notice of motion by Mr. Curran that the Council make a bylaw limiting the speed of motor cars on Ardmore strand was adjourned, when the Secretary said that the Guards will control the traffic.

Mr. Curran

In the course of the discussion said there is only one Guard in Ardmore and I can't see what one can do.

Mr. Dower

If a person is knocked down on the strand, are the Council responsible?

Chairman

That is a debatable point.

JANEVILLE-BALLYMOTLE ROAD.

Mr. N. Walsh moved a notice of motion which was seconded by Mr. Quirke and passed—
"That the Council agree to take over with a view to further maintenance 400 perches of the above road recently repaired under a special Employment Grant of £1,068, the local contribution being £188.
£500 TO BE BORROWED.
Subject to the sanction of the Minister, the Council decided on a vote of 9 for to 4 against, with 8 absentees and one not voting to borrow a sum of £5,000 to resume the paying of supplementary and other housing grants.
The matter was moved in the form of notice of motion by Mr. Dowd which Mr. Montayne seconded.

Co Board of Assistance

Mr. Rd. Barron, Chairman, presided at the monthly meeting of the above at the Court-house, Dungarvan, on Monday last. Others in attendance were: Deputies Kennelly and Kyne, Cols. T. Gallagher, M. Walsh, D. Fitzpatrick (Mayor of Waterford) W. Carroll and T. Lannon.

TENDERS.
The Acting Secretary (Mr. S. Glanville) informed the meeting that out of four tenders received for the supply of dentures for six months, a Dublin firm was the lowest.

Mr. Fitzpatrick held that if there is only a small difference it is usual to give the contract to a local firm. It seems hard that any of the two Waterford City contractors, who are paying rates in the City and rearing families could not get this, if the difference is only small.

Mr. Carroll spoke in support of the previous speaker's view.

When Mr. Fitzpatrick asked for the figures, the Secretary said he could not give them.

Mr. Lannon—I don't agree with that after all it's the public are paying.

The Secretary said that any of the members who wish to do so can inspect the figures.

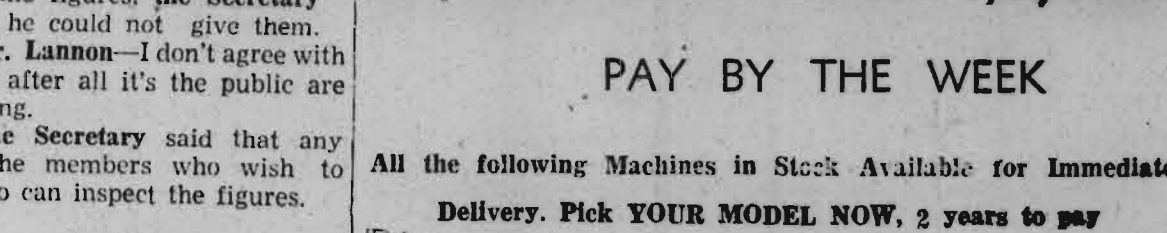
The annual general meeting of the above will be at the Commercial Club, Mary St., on Wednesday next, 18th June at 9 p.m. All members are requested to attend.
