### National Baking Competition

Last year, the National Ploughing Association introduced a new competition at the annual Ploughing Championship—a Wholemeal Bread Baking Competition. Because of the tremendous interest which this competition aroused the N.P.A. has arranged to hold a similar competition at this year's National Ploughing Championships which will be held at Bourn church, Co. Kilkenny, on January 28th-29th.

The preliminary competitions are held on a county basis and as the closing date for this is January 15th, prospective competitors should apply at once to their local Technical School or E.S.B. office for entry forms. An addition to the competition this year is the provision of a special student class for competitors aged 18 years and under. County champions will receive a prize and cash to cover their travelling expenses to the National Final and they will also carry the County Pennant.

There are worthwhile prizes for the national winners, the champion receiving £50 and the runners-up £30 and £20 respectively. All finalists in the senior class will receive consolation prizes. In the student class the first prize is a magnificent bicycle and runners-up will receive prize bonds. A special prize is being presented to the highest placed finalist who is a member of the I.C.A.

The competition consists of baking a 1 lb. loaf using not less than 12 ozs. of wheat and not more than 4 ozs. of flour and should be baked in an electric oven.

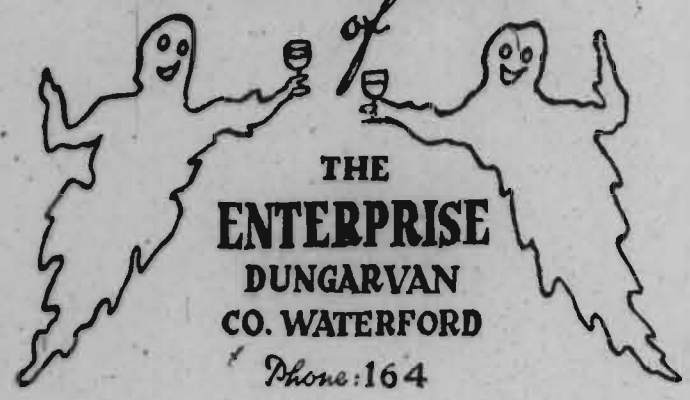

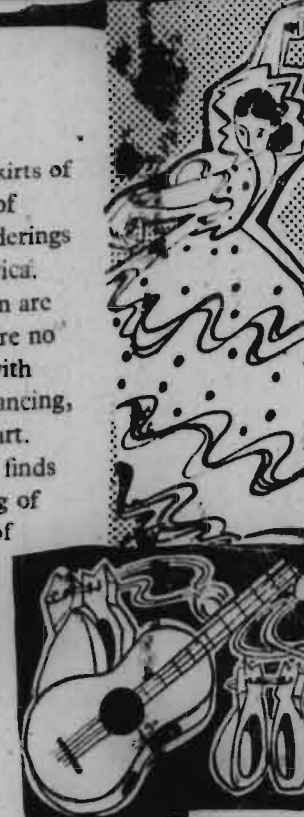

PASSING OF WELL-KNOWN EAST CORK GAEL Late Mr. Eamonn Fleming

Not only in his native East Cork but in all parts of the county and far beyond it, will members of the Gaelic Athletic Association mourn the passing on Christmas Eve of Eamonn Fleming, Vice-President of the Cork County Board, secretary for almost two generations of the East Cork Division and one of the best-known administrators of the games in the county.

At 88, Mr. Fleming had been in retirement for several years. A native of Cloyne, he spent much of his life as a popular and hard-working post-office official in Midleton until his retirement from the service in 1939.

His work for Gaelic games extended over half a century and in that time he earned the title of "Father of East Cork Gaelic". Small in stature but big in heart he won many distinctions for himself.

For over quarter of a century he cycled week after week between Midleton and Cork to attend meetings of the Co. Board. Later, when he was residing in Youghal, he cycled week after week to Midleton and frequently several times a week to attend East Cork meetings there, although he was by then no longer a young man.

His pen was, perhaps, better known than his voice, for he was tireless in composing detailed reports, circulars and letters which often played a big part in deliberations at Conventions and even Congresses.

His enthusiasm was both inspiring and infectious and it can truthfully be said that the strong position of Gaelic games throughout East Cork to-day is very largely due to his tireless organising work. There are many clubs in the Division in the founding and fostering of which he played a part.

His fund of anecdotes about the very early days of organised hurling and football seemed to be limitless. He could go well back beyond the days of Jamesie Dolher to tell of epic struggles in Cork, Thurles, Limerick and the old County Park.

The funeral which took place to North Abbey Cemetery after Requiem Mass in the Parish Church celebrated by Rev. E. G. O'Dwyer, C.C., was large and representative.

The chief mourners were Mrs. Margaret Fleming (widow), and Mr. Ed. Fleming (son). Very Rev. Canon Sheehan, P.C., officiated, assisted by Rev. E. G. O'Dwyer, C.C., Rev. J. Fitzgerald, C.C., Rev. P. Hennessy, C.C., Rev. B. Cotter, S.M.A., and Rev. D. P. Noonan, C.C.

N.F.A. NOTES

FERTILIZER CREDIT SCHEME - Views of N.F.A. President.

Speaking at the launching of Messrs. Gouldings Ltd. Fertilizer Credit Scheme, Dr. J. N. Greene, President of the N.F.A., said that it would help to take Ireland out of its present position of being in the lower bracket of European fertilizer users.

He regretted that the Credit Scheme would have to some extent be selective in so far as farmers would receive credit only on the recommendations of the merchant concerned. This however, was an inevitable aspect of a non-profit-making and otherwise unsecured loan scheme.

The interest rate of 1/2-in the £ for eight months or in other words 7 1/2% he regarded as reasonable, taking into consideration the administrative expenses.

He noted that the range of manures for which loans will be eligible will be mainly intended for grassland, and this would appear to be something of a contradiction in so far as the Scheme was a short-term one and grassland husbandry at the best must be medium or long-term.

BARLEY PRICES

The recent announcement by the Minister for Agriculture indicating that what sold by An Bord Grain is to be reduced by £2 a ton to £22 a ton and setting out arrangements for the issue of licence for the importation of coarse grain also referred to native barley prices.

The Minister stated that to ensure that stocks of native barley which were available for sale would be absorbed that he had consulted with the millers and the manufacturers of compound feeding stuffs and that he understood that they were to purchase such stocks at £25 a ton ex-store or £26 a ton delivered, at the seller's option.

Immediately before the Christmas convey that some merchants were having difficulty in finding outlets for native barley on their farms and that the prices being offered were on occasions below those suggested by the compound manufacturers. The N.F.A. has raised the matter with the authorities and has been assured that once the pattern of trade has time to settle down that the prices posted will be available to all who have barley to offer.

COUNTY CORK FRUIT COMMITTEE

At a recent meeting in Cork city, 80 fruit growers in that County decided to form an N.F.A. Fruit Committee. The Committee will be attached to the N.F.A. National Fruit Committee and will examine the potential of fruit growing with particular reference to the extent of markets and marketing arrangements.

The growing of soft fruits in County Cork has been progressing very favourably for the last few years. Trial plots have been grown under the guidance of the local instructors and it is felt that the industry is now sufficiently important to justify a Committee to look after its interests.

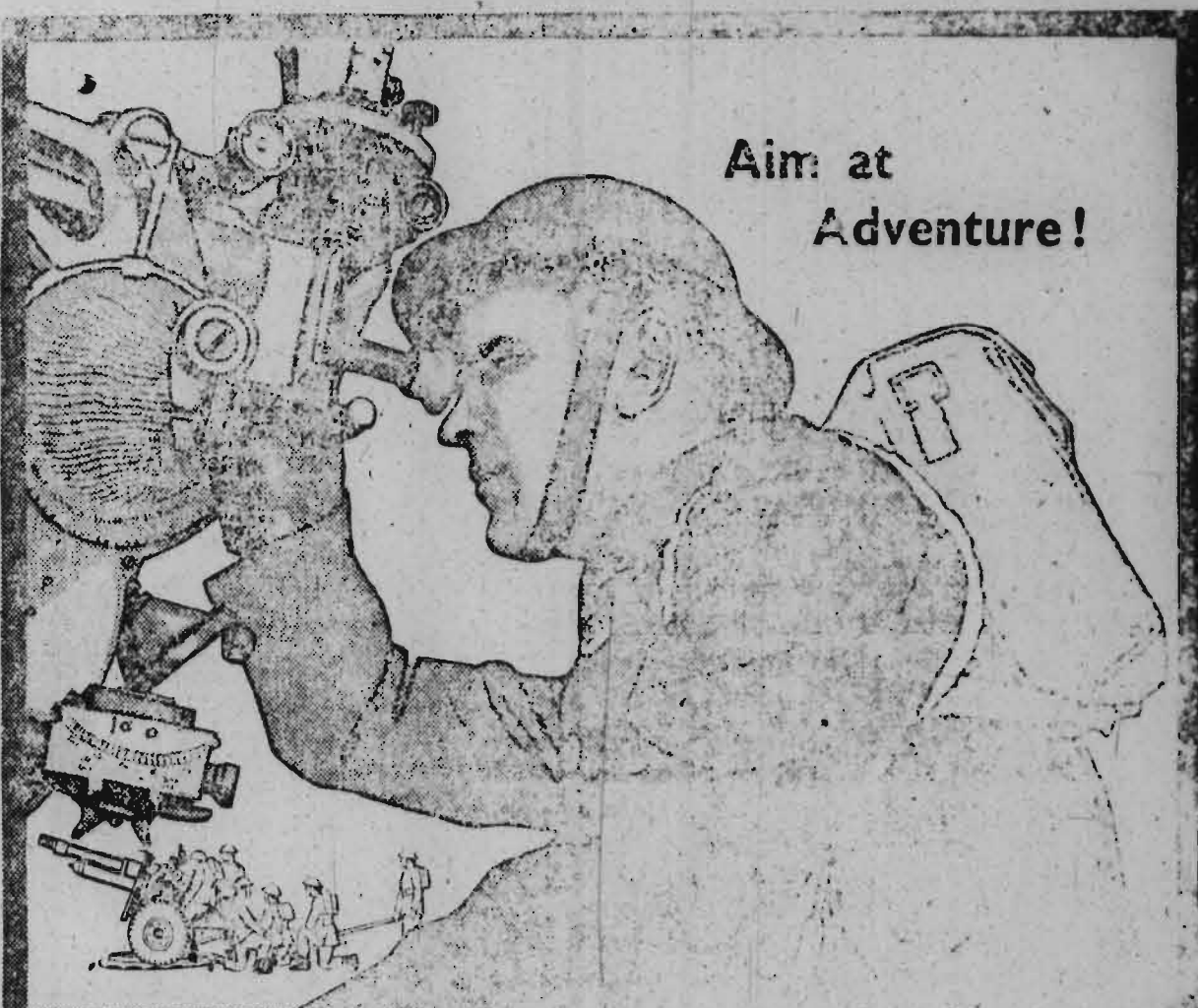

AMENDMENT IN SOCIAL WELFARE ACT

The Minister for Social Welfare has announced that under the Social Welfare (Amendment) Act, 1958, which will come into operation on Monday, 29th December, 1958, the remuneration limit for insurance under the Social Welfare Acts of persons on non-manual employment is raised from £600 to £800 per annum. Compulsory insurance is therefore extended to persons in non-manual employment whose rate of remuneration exceeds £600 but does not exceed £800 per annum, and employment contributions become payable in respect of their employment on and from 29th December, 1958.

Provision is made in the Act for crediting contributions to persons who, having previously ceased to be insured owing to their rate of remuneration having passed over £600 a year, are now brought back into compulsory insurance. If they have paid at least 20 contributions in respect of a former period of insurance under the Social Welfare Acts, such persons will receive sufficient credits to enable them to satisfy the contributions conditions for the receipt of unemployment benefit, disability benefit and maternity benefit. If one hundred and fifty-six contributions were paid in respect of a former period of insurance the contributions credited under the Act will enable persons to satisfy the contribution conditions for marriage benefit and treatment benefit.
