Seen off at Dungarvan's railway station on Wednesday by a group of their local friends were the members of Dungarvan's only Hungarian family who have left town. The members of the family were Mr. and Mrs. László Hudák, natives of Budapest and their five-year-old son László, with little one-year-old Lilián Dorian, who was born in Dungarvan and christened at the Parish Church on sponsors being Mr. Tom Dolan, O'Connell Street and Mrs. M. Duggan, O'Connell St.

Mr. Hudák, who fled with his wife and family from Budapest following Russian reprisals after the anti-communist regime's restoration four years ago, was employed as a construction worker at the time of his departure. He is now a fluent simultaneous interpreter in Hungarian, English and Irish. They left by liner from Cobh for the United States of America, where they will join Mr. Hudák's brother in New York City.

LATE MR. JOHN POWER ST. BRIGID'S TERRACE

A sterling character, a kind husband and a model father, passed away on the 11th May, when John Power, of St. Brigid's Terrace, Dungarvan, died in Cork.

He was born on 8th May, 1896, in Kiltipave, KilmacThomas, and grew up imbued with the Catholic ideals of living and a strong patriotism which distinguished him all his life.

John Power was a member of the Volunteers and served his country well in the troubled times. When the Emergency days arrived, he once again served his country in the National Army. He was a sincere patriot to the end.

For over thirty years he was an employee of Thomas Power and Co., Dungarvan, and became widely known in western and central county Waterford. The remains were received on Tuesday evening, 12th May, at St. Mary's Church, Dungarvan, by Rev. Fr. O'Farrell, C.C., assisted by Fr. O'Shaughnessy, O.S.A., and Fr. Byrne, C.C., and were followed by a large cortege. The burial took place on the following day and Rev. Fr. Murphy, C.C., officiated at the graveside, assisted by Rev. Fr. Byrne, C.C., Rev. Fr. Hally, P.P., Mullinahone, and Rev. Fr. Hickey, C.C., of Ballyvaughan and Grange-mohr.

May he rest in peace, Amen.

Department's Poultry Breeding Programme

The breeding programme with poultry at the Minister Institute, Cork, which is being carried out by the Department of Agriculture, is directed along five lines each of which is designed to produce better birds of types for particular purposes. The poultry plant at the Institute is being expanded to accommodate these birds for crossing with the yellow-skinned strains to produce white-skinned chickens with fast-growing qualities derived from both parents.

The fifth part of the programme is the production of a broad-breasted bronze strain of turkey by crossing the broad-breasted imported white stock with bronze strains and selecting bronze birds from the progeny for further breeding. It is hoped to develop a bronze strain of turkey which will meet the modern market requirements in conformation.

The turkey breeding unit at Athery Agricultural School is working on the breeding and propagation of broad-breasted white turkey stock originally imported from the U.S.A. Already the work done here has affected considerable improvement in the meat qualities of turkeys produced in many parts of the country and the work is being continued.

At Ballyvaughan Agricultural School, Co. Cavan, plans have been made for the provision of extra facilities for continuing the breeding and propagation work with broiler strains imported from the U.S.A. Four strains of White Rock and two of White Cornish are being worked on, and it is planned to distribute sexed pullets and cockerels to breeders. There is a good potential market for chicks of these strains outside the country, especially in Britain and Italy, and every effort will be made to work up this trade.

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The foregoing article is taken from the current issue of the Department's farm bulletin.

From 14th to 19th the group will visit counties Cavan, Westmeath, Galway and Monaghan performing in Cavan, Mullingar, Athlone, Kiltormer and Monaghan town. Then they cross over the Border to Armagh city on July 20th and will play in Belfast on July 21st. On the concluding day of their itinerary the U.S. traditional players will appear at Dublin's Mansion House on July 22nd and will conclude their scheduled trip at Ennis, County Clare, on 23rd July.

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BOUND FOR THE TROPICAL JUNGLES

Bound for the tropical jungles in the land of the head-hunters of South America is Rev. Father Robert Downey, S.D.B., son of Mrs. P. Downey and the late Patrick Downey, Woodhouse, Modelglo, Father Downey, who is currently on vacation from the Salesian Missionary College, Pallaskey, County Limerick, is visiting his mother and his sister Nora, in Modelglo.

He will leave this month with two other Irish priests, who volunteered for missionary work in South America, and will take up duty at the headquarters in Rio Negro, Amazonas, in north-west Brazil. This diocese has the equator line running right through it. It is about the size of Italy and is administered by Bishop Domestovitch, an Austrian, who has only fifty priests to serve so huge an area. There is one secular priest, a Hungarian, and the remainder are all members of the Salesian Order.

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The possibility of the accidental introduction of Colorado beetle into this country becomes greatest at this time of year, when this very serious pest of the potato crop is active in several other countries. The danger lies in the fact that live beetles may be imported in plant material of any sort and the Department of Agriculture urges everybody who imports anything of this nature to examine it carefully immediately on its arrival. If the insect suspected of being a Colorado beetle is found it should be sent in a safe container to the Department's office in Dublin.

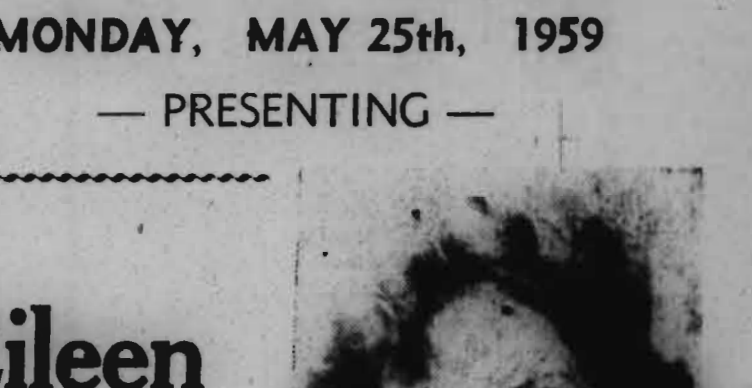

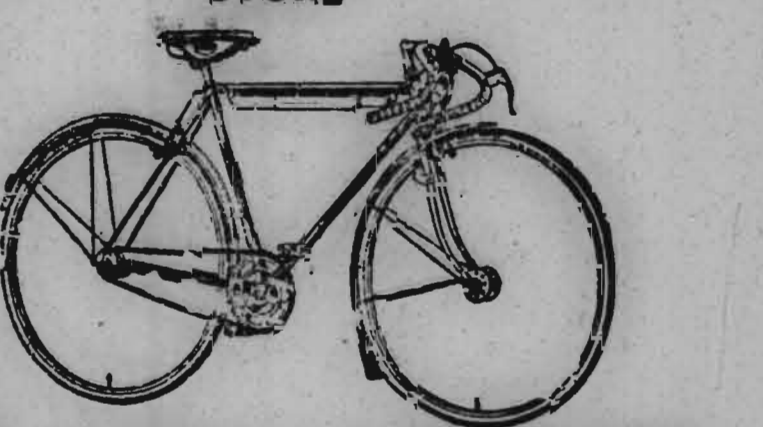

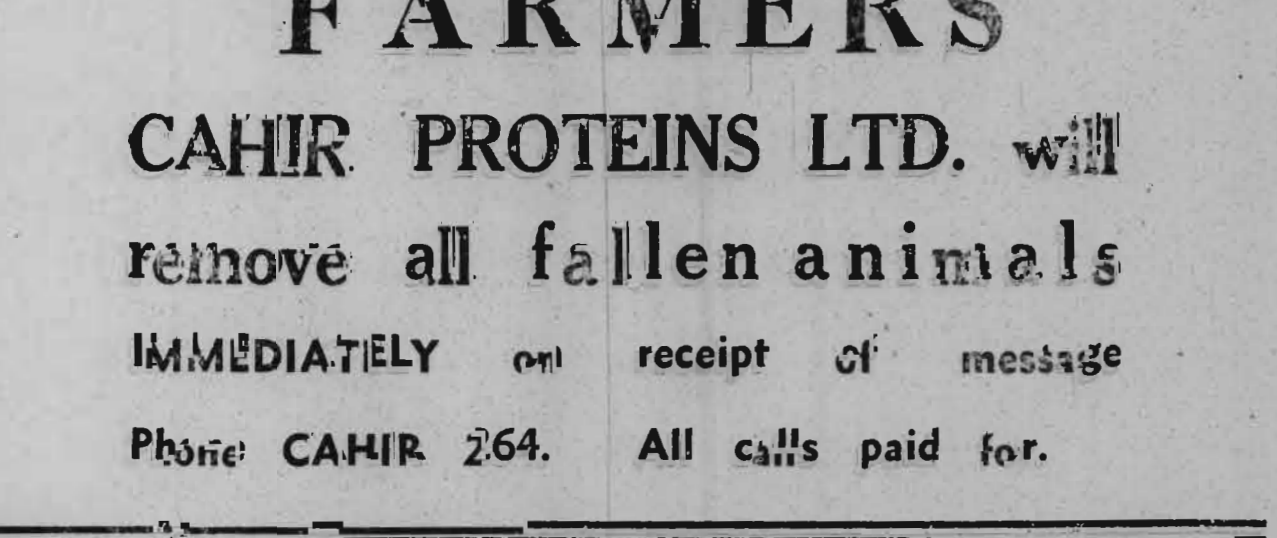
