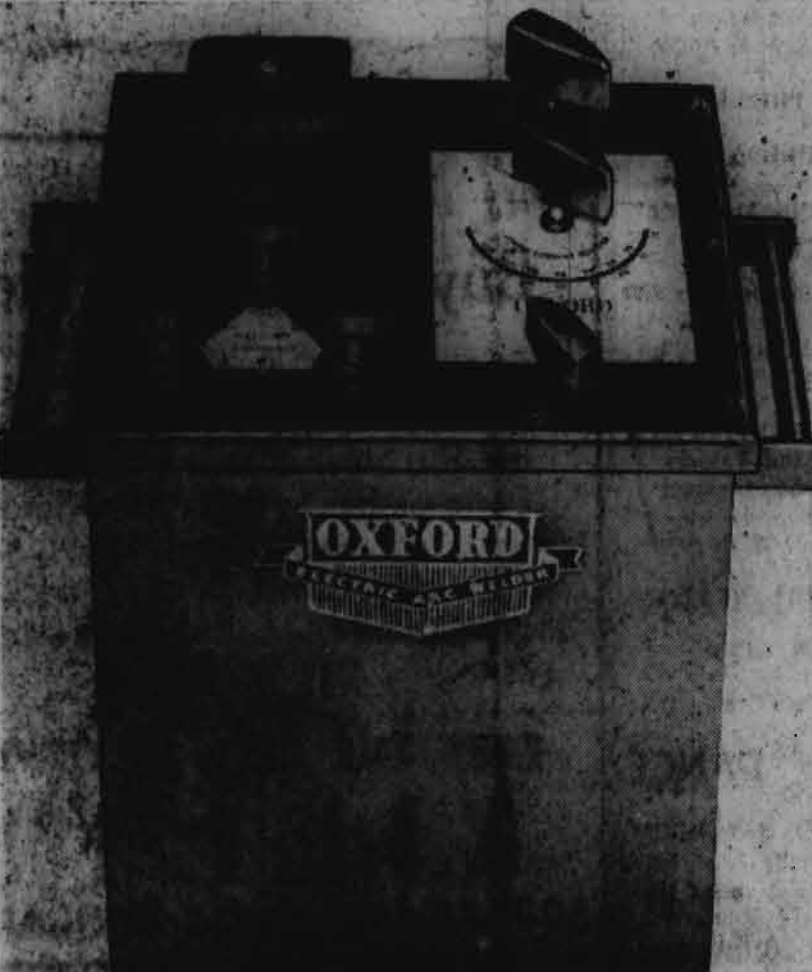

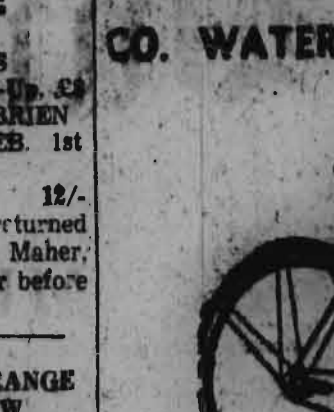

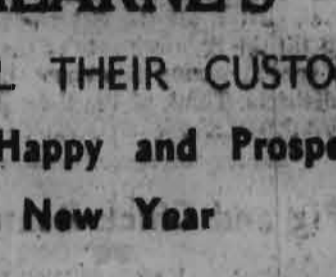

MORRIS MINOR MAKES MOTORING HISTORY

On Tuesday January 3rd, to the blare of factory hooters and the cheers of the workers, the 1,000,000 Morris Minor rolled off the assembly lines at Cowley, Oxford, adding a new page to British motoring history.

The Morris Minor, over 35,000 of which have been sold in the Republic of Ireland alone, might never have been evolved if it had not been for the war.

The shape of the Morris Minor is so familiar to-day that it is hard to believe that when it was first proposed many people thought it too revolutionary ever to be accepted by the public.

The first Morris Minor was produced on October 29th, 1948, and the model was introduced to Ireland in March, 1949.

In October, 1950, the two-door saloon and convertible models were supplemented by a four-door version and in October, 1952, maximum speed was increased, acceleration times improved, and fuel consumption reduced.

By now it had become obvious that performance which seemed ideal in the late forties must be improved to meet the demands of the fifties.

The popularity of the Morris Minor in Ireland is obvious from the number that can be counted on the roads. In fact, Ireland is the third largest buyer in the world outside Britain, and exceeded only by Australia and the United States.

A keen interest in the horse was manifest in the middle ages. Frederick II of the Holy Roman Empire was a great lover of horses and did much to improve the heavy war horses by importing Barbary mares.

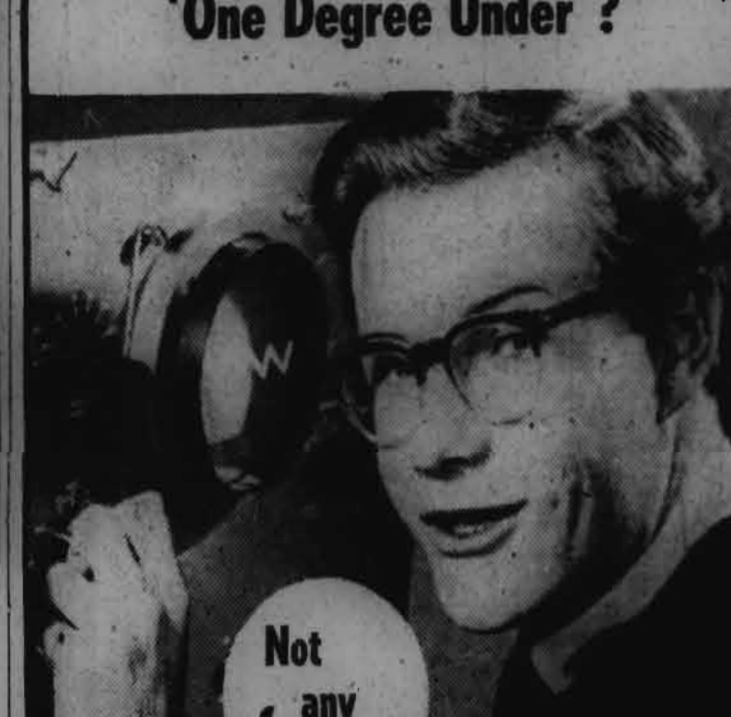
