Winter Air Services

The winter timetable of Aer Lingus Irish International Airlines, now in operation, shows an increase in the winter frequency of many cross-channel routes, the introduction of winter services from Cork and the operation of Boeing Jets from London in connection with the company's transatlantic flights.

Services on the Dublin/London route are increased to 48 return flights weekly—seven more than last winter. Four of these will be Boeing Jet services. There will be 23 flights each week on the Dublin-Manchester route, while the Dublin-Birmingham frequency will be increased by two return flights to 13 services weekly. Apart from the Dublin-Blackpool route services to other British provincial centres will be continued during the winter.

The winter frequency of services from a Cork—operating for the first time this year—provides two return flights daily between Cork and London in conjunction with Cambrian Airways Aer Lingus services between the two cities will be operated by Jet prop 227 Friendship, Bristol and Fairhill will each be served by four return flights weekly and daily service will operate between Cork and Dublin. The Cork-Paris service will operate on a new weekly basis and connections to other Aer Lingus destinations will be available through Dublin.

All continental services, with the exception of the seasonal services to and through Lourdes and the holiday services to Cherbourg, Jersey and Bernac, will be retained during the winter. There will be three return flights per week from Amsterdam, via Dusseldorf, to Frankfurt, Brussels and Luxembourg. Paris will be served by four services weekly on Mondays (via Paris, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday). The Friday service on this route continues on to Zurich and Rome and the Wednesday service to Zurich.

A special Christmas timetable will come into operation on 15th December but cater for the Christmas traffic which is particularly heavy as usual.

#### FOOTBALLERS IN ACTION AGAIN ON SUNDAY

Waterford footballers, presently riding the crest of the wave as a result of resounding victories over Kilkenny and Tipperary, will yet another Sunday away League points on Sunday next when they take on Clare at far away Kilmallock.

Since they won sectional honours a few years back for the first and only time in the county's history, has Waterford held such a commanding position in the league table. Today they have an unblemished record and hold undoubted leadership in their division.

Those victories over Kilkenny and Tipperary have given the county the unity and confidence needed in the big ball game and the long trek to the West Clare venue can be faced with justifiable optimism and confidence.

In both those outings the side displayed great spirit and determination. Never was this enthusiasm more fully displayed than on the day when they stayed at Kilmallock yet tremendous victory tally. At the close of the hour they had only a slender margin of one point to spare, yet supporters gained satisfaction not from the final narrow margin but from the manner in which victory was achieved.

The present County stand-off seems all set to restore the prestige so disastrously tarnished last May and already are, well on the road to doing so.

Undoubtedly from a Clare viewpoint the County is now deprived of leading the list. The decision of Kilkenny-Malloy to withdraw from the Association has hit the county hard at a time when they needed more than ever players to the team.

Already, Milow's decision has had its retrograde effects. It is to be later than Sunday, at least, that they dropped a precious point to Limerick. The loss of that point could yet be the ruin of their league hopes, and they cannot afford to lose any further ground.

Nevertheless, despite the present plight of the Banner County, they are never an easy side to overcome when playing on home soil.
