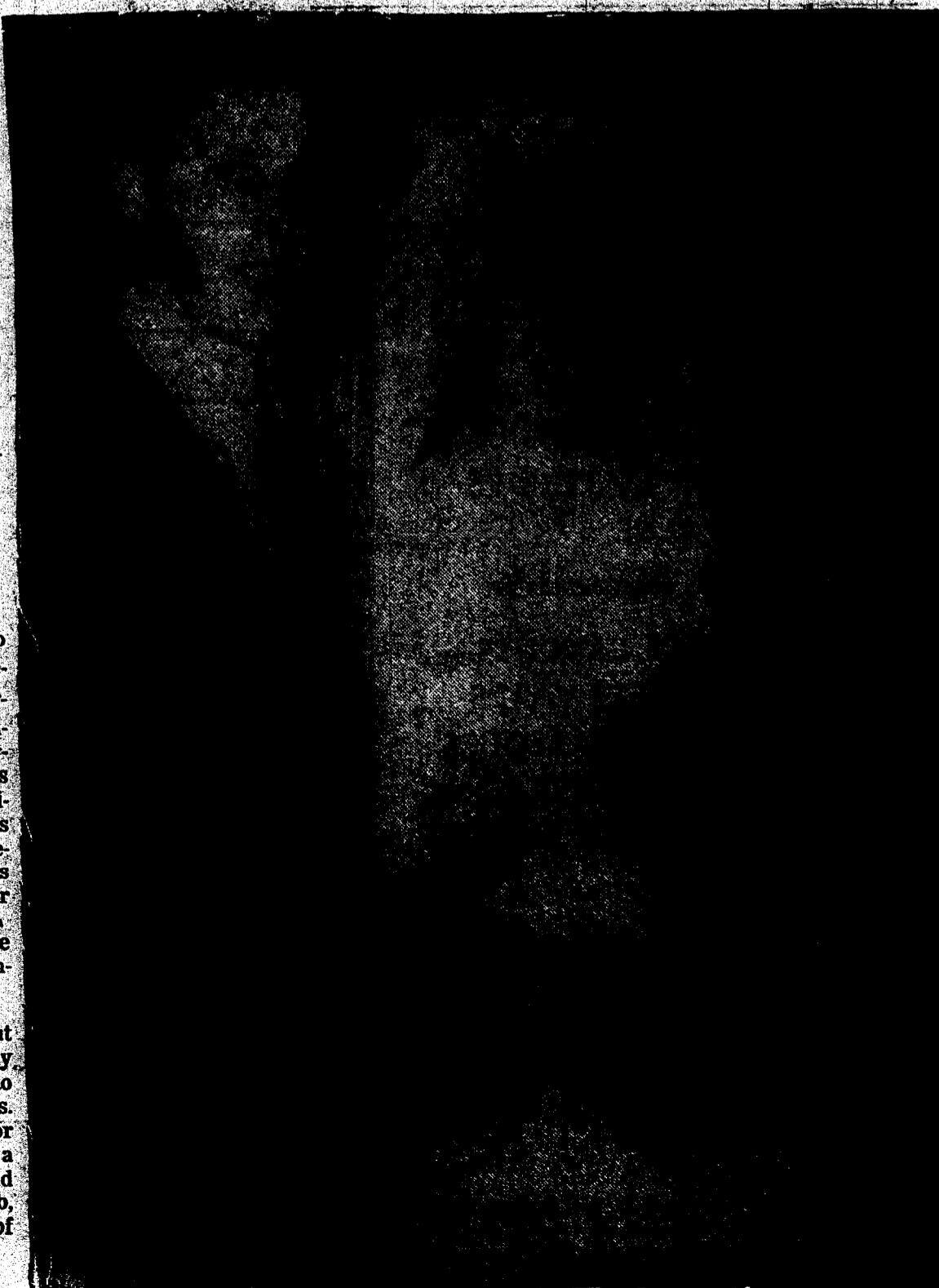

Colr. protests

Mr. Deelan Ahearn, M.C.C. at the last meeting of Waterford Co. Council warned that trees on the Knockanore-Youghal Road were proving to be extremely dangerous. Only last week Mr. Ahearn added, one of the trees fell on a school bus of children. Luckily no one was injured however, close on £1,000 damage has been done to the bus. The parents of the children are to meet, and they intend to protest, more than likely to the County Council, Mr. Ahearn continued. A notice should be served on the landowner, he concluded, that the trees be removed.

Mr. C. A. O'Connor, Co. Manager, said it was the responsibility of the landowner to remove the trees and not the Council.

The County Secretary is to write to the County Engineer on the legal aspects of the case.

Trial date fixed for May 14th

At the Special Criminal Court in Dublin on Friday last, the trial of the six men arrested in connection with the alleged attempt to import arms unlawfully was fixed for 14th May next.

Additional charges were preferred against all of the six accused by the State. Each of the accused already faced nine charges.

The six were — Joe Cahill, Belfast Republican, Denis McInerney, Ennis, Donal Whelan, Dungarvan, Gerard Walsh, do., Gerard Murphy, Ring and Sean Garvey, believed to be from Cahirciveen.

Cahill, McInerney and Garvey were each charged with being members of an unlawful organisation on March 28

last which raised or maintained an armed force contrary to the Constitution and with being members of an unlawful organisation styling itself the IRA on the same date.

Cahill, Garvey and Murphy were additionally charged that while aboard the Claudia, they refused to give an account of their recent movements to Garda Officers when requested to do so.

McInerney, Walsh and Whelan were charged with refusing to give to the Garda a recent account of their movements on the same occasion. This offence was alleged to have been committed while these three accused were aboard a motor lunch off Heivick.

Engineers refuse to use own cars

FIRST MOVE IN INDUSTRIAL ACTION

Waterford County Council engineers are refusing to use their private cars on official Council business. This is the first step in industrial action by them, announced on Monday last.

This action by the 9 engineers employed by the Council has been taken in support of a claim by the Amalgamated Union of Engineering workers for negotiating status under the national conciliation and arbitration scheme set up ten years ago. Their stand means they are refusing to drive their cars to any outside Council location points, which will make supervision of projects much more difficult.

When a fleet of taxis specially ordered drew up outside the offices on Tuesday morning, with instructions to convey engineers to and from their work destinations in different parts of the county, the engineers declined to use them.

The refusal to avail of them was on the grounds that a query by them regarding insurance cover had not been clarified.

Mr. J. Shine B.E., stated when this point had been cleared up they would then utilise the taxis.

Unless this matter is resolved satisfactorily a prolonged dispute looks inevitable.

Chairman complains of lack of communication

Councillors are not only entitled to an acknowledgement, but to a firm reply, Mr. C. Curran, Chairman of Waterford County Council, stated at the Councils monthly meeting held in Dungarvan on Monday last. Colr. Curran was complaining of the lack of communication between the County Engineers office and the councillors. When a request is sent into the County Engineers office, Mr. Curran said, all they ever get is an acknowledgment, they are never informed when the work will be carried out or when it has been completed.

Mr. Curran went on to say, that while they failed to receive a reply, private individuals had replies to similar representations within 24 hours.

Co. Manager, Mr. C. A. O'Connor said, Mr. Curran's comments were a surprise to him and he personally did not think they were failing on the job, from the public relations point of view.

It was unanimously agreed on the Managers suggestion, that members would be issued with monthly reports on progress, on roads and sanitary services, as is at present being done in housing matters.

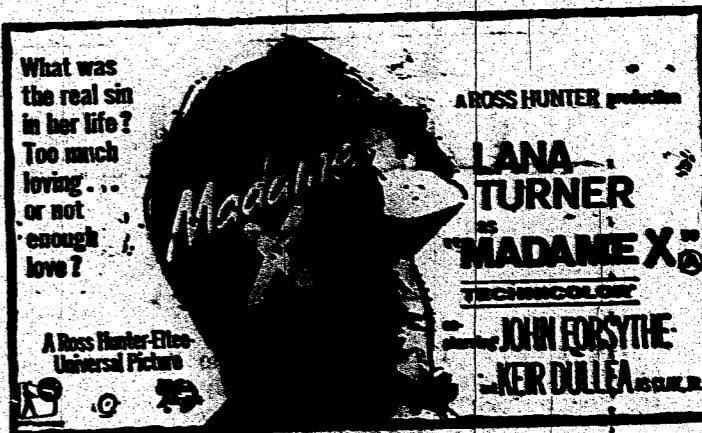

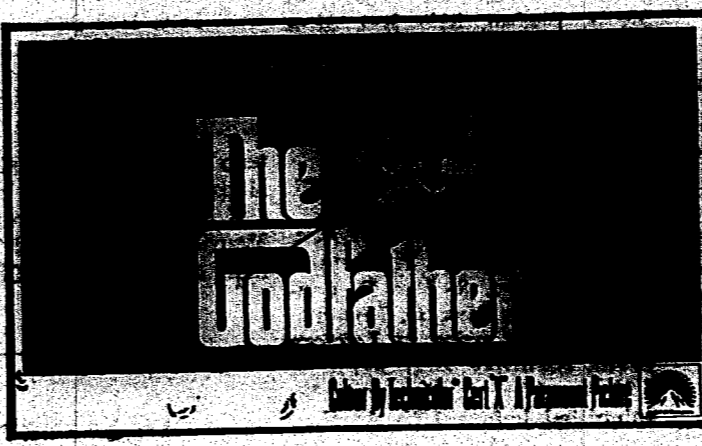

Small Farmers should have separate Instructor

At the last meeting of Waterford Co. Committee of Agriculture, Mr. T. Foley, M.C.C. said an instructor to deal exclusively with the small farmers, should be appointed and he would not be satisfied with their advisory service until this was done. As it is, he continued, there is a tendency among the instructors at present to visit the more highly developed farms to the detriment of the small farmers.

Mr. G. T. Frost, C.A.O. denied this and said that the instructors visit farms big or small, as soon as they are called upon. Mr. Frost said that at present there are 8 Agricultural Instructors employed, including two temporary ones. On May 1st the Senior Instructor, Mr. M. Byrne, would fill the post of acting deputy C.A.O. and they would then have an additional permanent man taking on duty. Mr. Frost continued, that in the Dungarvan area where the office accommodation was and where he was himself based most of the time they were giving a greater intensity of service than in the rest of the county. To ensure such an intensity of service all over the county, it would mean taking an additional staff, which he was not prepared to seek at this time.

At any one time there is 30% of the farming community availing of the advisory service, Mr. Frost replied to Mr. Foley. Chairman, Mr. K. O'Ryan said, that in his view they had ample staff and would not agree to any more being appointed. It was agreed to defer the question of staff numbers to a future meeting.

Social Welfare Benefits and the E.E.C.

E.E.C. Regulations on social security apply to Ireland from 1st April, 1973. The social security benefits affected for which the Department of Social Welfare is responsible are:—

Children's (Family) Allowances, Unemployment Benefit, Disability Benefit, Invalidity Pension, Occupational Injuries Benefits, Maternity Benefit, Death Grant, Widows (Contributory) Pension, Retirement Pension and Old Age (Contributory) Pension.

The Regulations provide for the protection of the rights to these benefits of persons covered by the Regulations moving within the E.E.C. The member States of the E.E.C. are:—

Belgium, Denmark, France, the Federal Republic of Germany, Ireland, Italy, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, and the United Kingdom.

WHO ARE COVERED BY THE REGULATIONS

The arrangements apply to insurably employed persons and their dependants and to social security beneficiaries and their dependants who are nationals of member States. The arrangements do not apply to persons who are not nationals of member States. An exception is made, however, in respect of stateless persons and refugees: these are covered by the arrangements if they are permanently resident within the Community.

The arrangements do not apply to self employed persons.

EFFECTS OF THE REGULATIONS

The Regulations will improve the position of Irish Nationals having employment in both Ireland and other member States of the E.E.C. This arises, principally, from the provisions permitting insurance records (periods of insurance) in the member States to be combined in determining eligibility for the various benefits. (Reciprocal Agreements between this country and the United Kingdom already permitted this.)

HOW EXISTING PAYMENTS MAY BE AFFECTED

Children's (Family) Allowances
Under the Regulations, children's of family allowances are normally the responsibility of the member State in which the father is employed and to whose legislation he is subject, even though his family may be living in another member State. Families in this country whose fathers are employed in the United Kingdom have been advised, already, by separate arrangements made with the British and Northern Ireland authorities. Anyone who missed the notice and who may be affected by it, may obtain a copy of it, on request, from the Information Section of the Department of Social Welfare, Dublin 1.

Families in this country whose fathers are Irish Nationals employed in another member State (other than the United Kingdom) may be entitled to family allowances from the country of employment. The mothers (or guardians) of these families should advise the fathers to contact the appropriate Department or Institution in the country concerned with a view to receiving family allowances there.

A person receiving Irish children's allowances who is in receipt of or becomes entitled to a social security benefit or pension from a member state other than the United Kingdom, should write to the Department of Social Welfare giving particulars of the benefit in question. Such a person may be entitled to family allowances from the country paying the benefit or pension. Where the social security benefit is from the United Kingdom, there is no need for the recipient to take any action as appropriate arrangements have already been made with the authorities in Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

WIDOWS PENSIONS

A widow in this country in receipt of a Widow's pension from any member State of the Community should apply now to have her title re-examined under the E.E.C. Regulations which permit the combining of insurances in different member States in determining title to these pensions if her late husband had insurable employment in more than one member State.

The application should be made to the Department of Social Welfare giving full particulars of the employment in the other member States, including the relevant insurance or registration numbers, if any.

OLD AGE AND RETIREMENT PENSIONS

Persons in this country in receipt of one of these pensions from any member State of the Community should apply now to have their title re-examined under the E.E.C. Regulations which permit the combining of insurances in different member States in determining title to these pensions if they have had insurable employment in more than one member State. Such applications should be made to the Department of Social Welfare, giving full particulars of the employment in the other member States, including the relevant insurance or registration numbers, if any.

AN EXPLANATORY LEAFLET DEALING WITH THE REFERRED TO ABOVE MAY BE OBTAINED, FREE SOCIAL WELFARE, ARAS MHC DHIARMADA

DISABILITY (SICKNESS) BENEFIT AND INVALIDITY PENSION

Under the regulations, where a person has been working in more than one member state liability for payment of benefit rests with the country in which the person was last insurably employed. Persons at present receiving disability benefit whose last employment was in the United Kingdom are therefore no longer eligible for Irish disability benefit after 1st April, 1973, but may qualify for United Kingdom sickness benefit instead. Persons receiving Irish Invalidity pensions may similarly qualify for United Kingdom Invalidity benefit under the Regulations, but they may opt to continue to receive their Irish Invalidity pensions instead. The persons concerned have been informed individually of their position and of the action they must take.

HOW FUTURE CLAIMS WILL BE AFFECTED

Children's (Family) Allowances
Nationals of this country going to work in any other member State in the future should claim family allowances from the competent institution of the country in which they are employed even though their families may continue to reside in this country or reside in another member State.

Unemployment Benefit

(1) A person with Irish insurance who takes up insurable employment in another member State may, where necessary, have all his Community insurances combined in order to qualify for unemployment benefit claimed in that State.

(2) A person in receipt of unemployment benefit in this country who goes to another member State in search of work may, under certain conditions, continue to receive Irish Benefit at an Employment Exchange in that country for up to three months. Similar facilities apply to insured persons coming or returning to this country from other member States.

DISABILITY BENEFIT, INVALIDITY PENSION, MATERNITY BENEFIT AND DEATH GRANT

(1) Claims to these benefits from persons in Ireland should be made to the Department of Social Welfare, which will advise what further steps should be taken.

(2) Liability for payment of benefit rests with the country in which the person was last insurably employed and payment will be made direct to him by the competent institution of that country. Insurance in another member State may be taken into account if this is necessary for the purpose of satisfying the contribution conditions for the benefit.

OCCUPATIONAL INJURIES BENEFITS

Liability for the payment of the benefits rests with the country in which the claimant is insured. In the case of persons resident in this country the benefits should be claimed from the Department of Social Welfare. Insured persons travelling between member States in the course of their employment are covered for these benefits.

WIDOWS PENSIONS

Insurance in any two or more member States may be combined for the purpose of establishing title to this pension. Title to the pension will normally depend on the husband's insurance record. Accordingly, a widow claiming this pension should furnish full details of all her late husband's insurable employment indicating the country of employment, the nature and periods of such employment and, where possible, his insurance or registration numbers.

OLD AGE AND RETIREMENT PENSIONS

Insurance in any two or more member States may be combined for the purpose of establishing title to these pensions. Accordingly, persons claiming these should furnish full details of all their insurable employment indicating the country of employment, the nature and periods of such employment and, where possible, their insurance or registration numbers.

NATIONALS OF OTHER MEMBER STATES WHO ARE IN IRELAND

Nationals of the other member States who are employed in this country and who are insured under the Social Welfare Acts are eligible for Irish children's allowances even though their families may be resident in another member state. Accordingly, they should apply, for payment of these allowances, to the Department of Social Welfare on claim form A.L. 2 which is available at all post offices.

Claims to other social security benefits by such persons should also be made to the Department of Social Welfare. The provisions of the E.E.C. Regulations outlined above will apply equally in their cases and their claims will be considered in that light.

Late Liam Breathnach

Old Parish, Dungarvan

The passing of (Liam Breathnach) Willie Walsh on Thursday of last week was received with equal sorrow and proud memory throughout Ireland and in foreign lands. It was not that he was a great traveller, seldom leaving home or going farther than Dungarvan; and it was not because he sought publicity or national acclaim. It was because he was a man in whom were reposed treasures that caused thousands to beat a path to his door.

Willie was the prince of tin-whistle players; his repertoire endless, his appreciation and memory for traditional music never exhausted. Even in his eighties he was 88 when he died) when other fingers were more supple than his, no one could ever copy the unique richness of tone.

To hear his rolling, resonant Irish as he warmed to a good discussion or to congenial company was an experience to be remembered. The power and sweep of his command of words and the subtle shades of meaning caused all who heard him at his best to realise what a poor thing, indeed, so much of modern written and spoken Irish (and English) is by comparison with the Irish of Willie Walsh and his generation.

These accomplishments, widely broadcast on radio over many years, brought people from every corner of Ireland to Walsh's public house in Old Parish. But, once they had come, it was the other qualities of their host which caused them to admire and love him as a person rather than a source of the language or the music. His wit, his humanity, his wise and salty comments, his ability to praise those who needed praise and to deflate the pompous.

Walsh's Cross has long been a focal point in the Old Parish, not least because of the character and dignity and the joy of living of the man who lived there. He made all of us, so caught in the complexities and tensions of modern life, marvel at the way he had everything so easily fitted into place. Influences and tendencies that seem to pull us in contradictory directions were to him all of a pattern. The jigsaw of life and eternity had long since been solved by him.

In a moving panegyric, his Parish Priest, Rev. Fr. Flavin instanced the depth of his faith; the steadfastness of his religious practice; and the kindness of his heart. He pointed to the remarkable fact that the man who had never missed a First Friday throughout his life should have been brought home to his Parish Church on the First Friday of April.

An enormous funeral cortege followed the coffin on Friday evening, when the remains were brought to Old Parish Church; and, on Saturday morning, the burial took place with another large crowd present. Fr. Flavin and An tAthair Mac Aogain C.C. celebrated Masses, and Fr. Flavin committed the coffin to the grave and the departed soul to heaven. While the sun still shone, a little shower of rain fell at that moment.

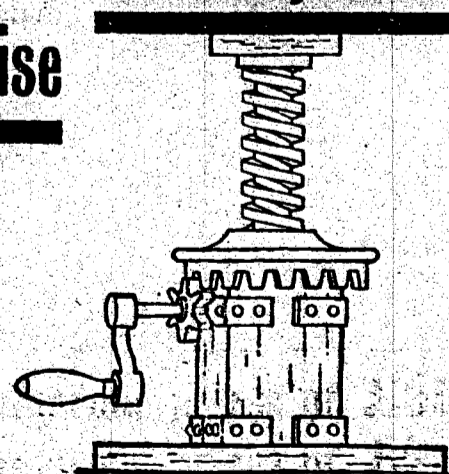
