6. Naples and the Two Sicilies. In Naples a negotiation is now going on, respecting the appointing of Bishops. In Sicily the nomination is exclusively in the Crown.

7. Sardinia, Piedmont, & Savoy. By a brief of Pope Nicholas V. of 1451, the Sovereign of Sardinia has the privilege of naming to all the Bishopricks.

8. France. By the Pragmatic Sanction of St. Louis, in 1208, the Bishops of France were elected by the Deans and Chapters...

9. Spain. The patronage of all ecclesiastical benefices is in the King. He presents to all vacant sees, and requires that the necessary bulls should be immediately transmitted by the Pope...

10. Portugal and the Brazils. The prerogatives of the Crown have been uniformly contended for and supported, both with respect to the nomination of Bishops, and a control upon the admission of papal rescripts.

11. Switzerland. At Coire, the Court of Rome has no right to interfere in the election of Bishops, which is made freely by the twenty-four Canons.

12. The Greek Church, Empire of Russia. The Archbishop of Mohilow, and all other Bishops, are named by the Emperor, who are confirmed by the Pope.

13. Denmark. No Catholic Bishops. Catholic Priests receive their appointments from the Bishop of Hildesheim, who exercises the delegated authority of a Vicar Apostolic in relation to several States of Germany in which he is not resident.

14. Sweden. The King authorises, "by Diploma," the Vicars Apostolic to exercise their functions throughout the Kingdom, conforming themselves to the Edict of Toleration.

15. Prussia. The appointments to the Episcopal Order are, generally, in the Crown; but whenever the appointment or nomination of the Bishop has not been reserved to the Crown...

16. Netherlands. Negotiations are now going forward respecting new regulations between the Pope and the King.

17. Hamburg. No Catholic Bishops, and no Papal Edict allowed to be published.

18. Saxony. No Catholic Bishop since the Reformation, except the Confessor of the King, who has the authority of a Vicar Apostolic.

19. Hanover--Hesse-Baden. Negotiations are now pending relative to Ecclesiastical Regulations.

20. Canada, and the British Colonies. The manner in which the Bishops are appointed is detailed in the Appendix.

Parliament will be prorogued to-morrow. The Prince Regent will prorogue it in person.

PARIS, HALF-PAST FIVE, JUNE 27. A horrible plan was laid to blow up with gunpowder the Duke of Wellington, and the superior officers of the British Army now at Paris, as well as all the younger branches of the Royal Family who honoured the illustrious Field-Marshal with their presence at his Ball and Supper given on Tuesday, the 25th inst. on account of the christening of the child of Mr. Harvey Aston.

"Sir Robert Wilson has obtained permission to reside at the Hotel of his Lady during the time of her illness, which is supposed to be most serious. He is on parole not to quit his apartment, but his friends are allowed to see him."

We have received the Paris Papers of Wednesday and Thursday. They contain two articles, upon which an observation or two seem to be necessary. The first is an account of the trial of General Gilly, par contumace. He is accused of having betrayed the King before the 23d March, 1815.

The second article is a kind of history of the 28 persons denominated the Patriots of 1816, whose trial was to begin last Thursday. In all the Paris Papers of that day there is this history, which resembles the opening speech of an Advocate, and which might have been spoken by the Attorney-General to the Court and Jury before whom the Prisoners are to be tried.
