

The mail of Tuesday was due when we went to press, and we cannot say much of the importance of the communications conveyed by that of Monday. If the Courier is to be credited, the Elections in France are proceeding in favour of the Ultra-Royalists, but this is the wish of that Journal, and it may be, that it makes the intelligence which it gives correspond with its political views. It is, indeed, to be observed, that the Elections appear to be of a very mixed character, but it is almost impossible to ascertain what will be the general result.

The Princess of Wales, it is now stated, instead of visiting Venice, was on her way to Switzerland. The Morning Chronicle mentions, that the ship *Albatross*, of Liverpool, owned by Mr. B. of Manchester, has been carried into a port in Spain, and is now being detained. The goods were sold by public auction, and the proceedings of the Captors were of a most outrageous nature. The *Albatross* was being used in its usual style of monopoly, and the goods were to be introduced into the interior, where they were to be sold at a high price.

An Officer who was in the action, at a late date, states, that the enemy were not very successful in their operations. Broken guns, and other articles of a similar nature, were seen in profusion, and did no little mischief. The number of the enemy's gun amount to 10 or 12 of different calibres, one of them with a barrel on the Myle Gateway, which it was thought, if four rounds, exclusive of six Dora's firing, would, and five gun-boats, were only 700 men. By inquiries as to the amount of loss on the part of the Algerines, it appeared, that in killed only, 5000 Janissaries, and from 5 to 6000 Arabs, fell, besides women and children. A ship, thrown from one of the bombs burst in a house where nine children were assembled, and instantly killed the whole; and there was scarcely a less injury from the bombardment.

An interesting event occurred on the beach, while the Treaty with the Dey was pending. Mr. Aitchison, a marine artillery officer, happened to meet a Frenchman, who had been in captivity for fifteen years, asked him if he would like to return to France in the French ship which lay in the bay. He indignantly replied, that he felt ashamed of his country, but would go any where with the brave English, who had so kindly liberated him.

Only 24 hours before the Dey returned for an answer that he would comply with any terms, and signed the Treaty accordingly, he told his principal Officers, that he would have us to white-wash his walls in less than half an hour after the commencement of the action.

The 61st regiment, at Cumberland Fort and Tipper, were to embark this day at Portsmouth for Jamaica. Lord Stanhope is dangerously ill at Cherrington, his seat, near Seven Oaks, in Kent. His Lordship is attended by the neighbouring Physicians, and occasionally visited by Sir Henry Hall, of London.

The Earl of Egmont has suffered a severe attack of the complaint which attacked him last year, but we are happy to hear that this most anxious and distinguished Nobleman is re-established in his health. He was attended by Dr. Baubak, of Brighton.

Herbert Marsh, now that he is made a Bishop, will, it is to be hoped, give up the pen in his hand for some years—what he had it for, he said his masters only can tell!

Mr. Leach, Chancellor to the Prince-Bishop is arrived at Paris.

The Duchess of Wellington arrived at five in the evening at Cambay, and proceeded immediately to Mount St. Martin. The Duke of Wellington left Cambay on the 6th for his residence.

A letter from Arras, dated October 8, says:—A great movement of the Allied Troops is announced for the 10th of this month. Several corps will pass under the ramparts of Arras, without entering the city. These troops are marching towards Cambay and other points. They have their *trains* of artillery with them.

Corn-Exchange, Oct. 10.—Though there was a good supply of new Wheat this morning, the demand was considerable, at an advance of 5s. per quarter in all descriptions; Red, 65s; Barley, 12s; Beans, 4s; Peas, 4s; Oats, 25s; and Maiz, 12s. per quarter dearer than last Monday.

Waterford, Oct. 10.—The conveyance of the *Albatross* to Waterford, by Thomastown, is unquestionably the cheapest and most direct by which it can be carried, but has been put a stop to this week, on the serious inconvenience of the citizens of Kilkenny, and of the farmers and dealers of the merchants of Waterford, our natural port of supply and of export. Therefore, letters might be sent from Kilkenny to Waterford, and the answers received, within 10 hours—by

the new plan, it cannot be accomplished within 96 hours! or double the time requisite in our correspondence with Dublin, which is twice the distance of Waterford from Kilkenny! So very *outré* an arrangement, especially in the peculiar circumstances of the country, requires a serious and immediate remonstrance to the Postmasters-General, to which we intend the powerful aid of the Commercial Interest of Waterford. In the meantime, we beg to inform such of our subscribers as write their papers through the Thomastown post-office, that we have made arrangements to have them left at that office by nine o'clock on the morning of publication, until the Postmasters-General shall see meet to relieve us from this inconvenience, which we trust will be soon.—*Modest*.

The fine weather continues—all hands are busy—and all spirits are buoyant—and in a few days we shall doubtless have a comparatively favourable report of the state of the harvest to lay before the Public. Yesterday, Oats brought 10s. a barrel in our market than on that day week! We are assured, by good authority, that much of the grain has been tolerably well saved, and that some more of it still awaits the sickle, and may afford a moderate produce. We believe, that those who estimate the acreable deficiency of the Wheat crops in general at one-fourth, or at most, at one-third of an average produce, will be found to have made sufficient allowance for all the untoward circumstances to which they have been exposed; and when it is considered, in consequence of the peculiarly discouraging price of Barley last year, that Wheat was grown to an unusually great extent, we may safely conclude, that the produce of the latter will not, on the whole, fall far short of an average supply.—Barley, which, at the approach of harvest, promised to afford an abundant produce, has suffered materially, we are informed, by the late continued rains, but of this species of Corn some has been saved in a good state, and new harvest may still repair much of the injury it has sustained.—Oats, it is well known, are a hardy grain, and have accordingly suffered much less than the other kinds of Corn. There is reason, however, to apprehend a deficiency, though not considerable, in the general supply of that crop. The Potato crops, as affording the principal article of food to the most numerous class of the People, are a peculiarly interesting subject of inquiry, and we are happy to learn, that, whatever diminution there may be in the productiveness, will be compensated by the extensive cultivation of that valuable root. The *grazing* season was favourable, and the price during last year was sufficient to stimulate exertions.—*Ed.*

Barley, Oct. 10.—The fine weather, which we have had for some days has already produced a very salutary effect upon the Markets. Corn, which was, at the beginning of last week, 27s. per cent, was, yesterday 18s.; and in Liverpool market, oatmeal, which had been on the preceding Tuesday 25s., fell yesterday to 22s. The same cheering effect of the return of a propitious season has been experienced in the price of potatoes, which crop, being the chief food of the poor, is much in want of dry weather to improve the quality.

Corn, Oct. 10.—The weather has, providentially, continued favourable from the time we first found it necessary to advert to the state of the harvest; and the benefit to the different crops has been, accordingly, equal to our most sanguine expectations. The information received, since our last, from various parts of the country, is highly gratifying; and we are enabled to refer, from our own observations of an extensive district, during the interval, that the gloomy representations which have been made of the general state of the country are grossly exaggerated. In the cold and elevated parts of the barony of Barrymore, in which we should suppose the injury to the crops had been greatest, we found it to have been much less than has been represented by prejudiced persons of the general condition of the country. On Monday the greatest part of the corn in that district had been stacked; and we conclude, from the fairness of this day, that a considerable portion of the remainder has been placed in security.—*Cork Advertiser.*

October 17.—The weather has again broken, and at a bad moment. Till yesterday, it continued dry, but without sun or wind; nevertheless, much good had been done since this day week, the Farmers having been busily employed in turning the sheafs, stacking and carrying. Yesterday morning, however, the recommencement of rain was certain, and from twelve o'clock till late evening, it descended heavily and incessantly. Great injury has been done in consequence, as the change in the weather was sudden and unexpected, and several crops, which had been out during the few fine days, were entirely exposed to this new inclemency. The rain was succeeded by a hard frost, which was used this morning, when the rain was again a C. and it has continued with little intermission all day. We have conversed with several country Gentlemen, who have come to town, and they have assured us, that this and yesterday's rain has done incalculable injury, and they fear we are on the eve of a determined frosty season. The consequence of frost now, when every thing is so green, would be frightful, particularly to the potato crop, and at the moment it was so green, and so dependent on the sun, and a chilling and unseasonable fall.—*Waterford Mercury.*
