

MEETING OF THE COMMON HALL.

On Friday, a Common Hall was held, for the purpose of considering an Address of Congratulation to her Majesty the Queen, and to take into consideration the conduct of Alderman Bridges, late Lord Mayor, as it affected the rights and liberties of the Livery and the Citizens of London.

At a few minutes after one o'clock, the Lord Mayor, followed by Alderman Wood, the Sheriff, and attendants, and a great number of the Livery, took his seat in the Hall. The usual ceremonies being performed by the Clerg.

The Lord Mayor addressed a few words to the Meeting. The respectability of the signatures to the requisition had induced him to convene the Hall. The object was two-fold: to deliberate on an Address to the Queen, and to take into consideration the conduct of the late Lord Mayor.

In respect to the latter object, he hoped that nothing injurious would be imputed to him in having consented to call a Meeting having that, among others, for its object. He felt himself bound to accede to a requisition so regularly and respectfully signed, and be knew of no power which he possessed to prevent the Livery from taking the conduct of any officer of the Corporation, whom they might choose to select for the purpose, into consideration.

He craved an impartial hearing for all parties and opinions. The Requisition and signatures were then read. Mr. Coates advanced, and said, that he was proud of being the first Liveryman to address the first Hall convened during the present Mayoralty.

He had reason to be proud of their present Chief Magistrate, who had been exalted to his seat, not by rotation, but by choice—not of right, but election and preference. There were other causes of reasonable congratulation.

When last the Hall met to address the Queen, they were surrounded by a military force; now, they and their Magistrate were only surrounded by the best affections, the devoted confidence, and ardent patriotism of the citizens of London.

He was not ignorant of the responsibility of the task which had devolved upon him. It was impossible for him to forget, that he was standing on those boards which had for so long a period been occupied by tried patriots, struggling in defence of their liberties and rights.

"We were that week routed by the arrival of the Res. Mr. Wilson, with an account of a revolt in a company of the 33rd West India Regiment, that had as a temporary measure been sent from Trinidad to Tobago, and infatigable reports soon magnified it into an insurrection of the negroes, and an attempt to burn the town; however, there really were grounds sufficient to induce Sir Frederick Robinson to embark immediately with two companies of the Fusiliers. Whilst I am writing, the Lady Combermere (army vessel) has come in from Tobago; she has brought up the two companies of the 4th Foot from that Island to consistate. As might be imagined, all is quiet at Tobago; the company of the 33rd West India Regiment has been sent back to Trinidad, after due example being made of the instigators of the disturbance. I do not believe that any capital punishments have been found necessary."
