

attend the establishment of Mr. Talbot, called upon the Plaintiff and conversed with him. The Plaintiff received him with coolness, and asked if he had ever seen Mr. Talbot? to which Mr. Salmon replied in the negative.

Witness then left Plaintiff, and called again upon him on Monday morning, when he called the keepers were gone. Dennis was perfectly sane, and stated the circumstances of the case to a Magistrate. On the same evening (Monday), witness went to Mr. Talbot with an account of his rents, made out by Mr. Dennis; that account had been made out in the course, witness believed, of the same day.

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Mr. Willmore, a surgeon, knew the Plaintiff previous to the 23d of June, and was in the habit of seeing him frequently; has frequently seen him since, and never doubted his sanity.

Dr. Pett examined by the Solicitor-General. Is a physician residing at Hackney, and went by desire of Mr. N. Williams, on Sunday, the 4th of June, to see Mr. Dennis. Witness saw Mr. Dennis and made all necessary inquiries. He had a long conversation with him, and had no question that he was then perfect master of his reason. He saw no cause for supposing that there had been any recent privation of reason.

Mr. Henry Mercer produced a letter of business, written by the Plaintiff on the 4th of June, 1820. In the neighbourhood of Bethnal Green there is a chapel, called "The Jews' Chapel," from the circumstance of its having been designed for the conversion of Jews, and for the worship of the converted. The Plaintiff was a regular attendant at that chapel. Witness was also a regular attendant, and never saw any thing indecorous in the Plaintiff's conduct.

Mr. Joseph Dennis is the paternal uncle of the Plaintiff, and was for some time employed by him to call at his rents. Remembers his illness in May, 1819. Saw him once upon that occasion; he was then strapped down in his bed. After Plaintiff's recovery he went with his mother into the country. Mrs. Dennis died on the 13th of November, 1819. Witness remembers going once to the Plaintiff's house in March, 1820.

Mr. William Cordell proved the handwriting of Mr. Salmon's certificate of the Plaintiff's lunacy, dated 31 June, 1820. The Lord Chief-Justice, in summing up the evidence, lamented the death of Mr. Salmon, and the absence of the maid-servant, Charlotte Alton. The Plaintiff was, at all events, entitled to a verdict; but, upon the question of damages, there were two points for the consideration of the Jury.

PARIS, Dec. 16.—Mr. Wellsley Pole, brother of the Duke of Wellington, will succeed Lord Stewart in the post of British Ambassador at the Court of Vienna.

Y. S. (Friday) evening, at half past six o'clock, Mr. Naldi, bull-fighter at the Opera, met an untimely death by the bursting of a well-known cocking system. Mr. Naldi was invited to dine with his colleagues, M. Gavio, who, agreeably to his wish, brought him to the opera.

MADRID, Dec. 5.—The municipality has caused to be printed and propagated an Address which they presented to the King on the 22d inst. in which, after expressing to his Majesty their satisfaction at the measures which he has authorized to be enforced against all those who adhere to their excesses, they call for a more wretched condition, and this Country must have peace, or the consequences will be disastrous.

After stating that agents are active in exciting distrust and hostility towards the Constitutional Government, by proclaiming that the King is secretly adverse from its measures; and that to defy its authority, and obstruct its course, is conformable to the wishes of his Majesty, the address continues, "this is the origin of the evil. The remedy is obvious. In your palace, in your chapel, in your stables, the royal retainers, exist those who shelter themselves under a false pretence of absolute devotion to your person; they are the authors of these commotions, at least the People accuse them as such; and, as long as facts do not prove that your Majesty regards as your personal enemies the enemies of the New Institution, however zealous they may be, to prevent disorders. Finally, Sir, you must be informed, that on the day of your return to the capital, prerogative agents distributed money to mislead the people, and to engage them to destroy the constitutional system, in making the name of your Majesty; we, therefore, supplicate that you will take prompt measures to undeceive those who disturb public tranquillity in the name of the King."

FRANKFORT, Dec. 10.—We have just learnt that the Baron de Schrantz, the Austrian Minister, who habitually resides at Berne, has received an extraordinary courier from Vienna, with despatches of a nature so important, that he instantly set off for Loosanna. It appears that he is charged with a diplomatic communication, which concerns all the States of the Swiss Confederation.

NEW BANK NOTES.—The machinery and plate for the £5 notes have been completed some time, and about one million and a half are printed; 70,000 per day are struck off, and the issue at the Bank averages about 60,000, so that there are plenty of Ones now ready; but it is said the Directors have ordered the numbering those notes by machinery; consequently, it will take a considerable time before they are completed. The £5 notes are also ready for working, but the larger ones are still in an unfinished state.
