SECOND ATTACK ON MR. GRUBB'S FLOUR CARTS.

On Wednesday, the 11th inst., a laden flour cart, with four men, was a second time attacked, and ten sacks of flour forcibly taken away near the Turapike gate, County Waterford. The military and a police, under Dr. Fitzgerald, C.M. went immediately to the scene of the attack, and soon after returned with the pike keeper in custody, having found some flour in the gate house. Much astonishment was felt by the public on seeing this man in custody; and, upon inquiry, we learned, that in this house there were several inmates with whom he had no connection, and in whom, perhaps, any inbred blame should be imputed. On yesterday about 500 people paraded, in procession, the streets, headed by a person who carried a loaf of bread on a pole; this person and some others were taken into custody by the police at the Court-house. The people appeared a good deal excited on the occasion.—Tipperary Free Press.

THE ARMY.
