On Friday last a memorial was handed in to the city Grand Jury from the Rev. Aitken Sargent and the Rev. Patrick Morrissey, seeking an advance in their salary as Chaplains to the City Jail. The memorial states that the present salary of £200 was fixed there was but one person to attend, but that now there were two—the Jail and the Penitentiary, or Female Prison, which was some distance out of town. The Grand Jury, upon the motion of Mr. Denny seconded by Alderman Ardagh, unanimously resolved that each Chaplain's salary be £10 in future.

To the Editor of the Waterford Chronicle. Ross, February 23d, 1836. Permit me through the columns of your interesting paper to draw the attention of those persons concerned in the navigation of the river between Check Point and New Ross, to what, if permitted to be carried on much longer, will render the navigation of vessels of a large class to the town wholly impeded, and I trust if this letter meet the eye of the contractor of the new line of road to Waterford, viz. Lucy Rock, he will see the necessity of discontinuing a practice which would eventually be of irreparable injury to the trade of Ross. Whether by order of such contractor, immense quantities of stone-rubbish and stuff, dug in making the new road above mentioned, are thrown over the rock into that part of the river called the West Channel, and at the very narrowest part too, not being more than 45 or 50 feet wide at this point; this most unwarrantable, this being the depth of the water, and the width of the channel, and a half of low water. But if the practice I here allude to is continued, the flow being so narrow at this point, it would eventually become as shallow as other parts of the river. If such conduct on the part of those road-makers be not immediately discontinued, I call on the merchants and shipowners of Ross, in defence of their trade and navigation of the river, to take immediate steps for its prevention.
