Certain it is, however, that neither the diplomatists, the Press, nor the public of England dreamed that these indirect claims would be submitted to the Court of Arbitration. WATERFORD FEBRUARY FAIR. THE monthly fair of Waterford was held yesterday (Monday), on the hill of Ballybricken, and was the dearest which has been held for a long time. The farmers especially assembled in great numbers, both buyers and sellers, and stock of all kinds rapidly changed hands. A reaction in favour of purchasers of cattle has evidently set in, now that the foot and mouth disease has disappeared from this district. The day was highly favorable, and buyers of beef and mutton attended in considerable numbers from the English markets, from Dublin, and from the surrounding towns, especially Clonmel and Kilkenny. Our local victuallers had not it all their own way, but generally managed to hold their own against all competitors. There was a fair supply of fat cattle, but the animals exposed for sale were by no means equal to the demand.
