





On Wednesday morning last, a range of out offices belonging to the Rev. War. Higgins, Roscrea, was consumed by fire.

A company of the 97th marched from head quarters at Limerick on Monday last, the 14th inst., for Bruff and arrived same day to occupy barracks.

The remaining company of the 22d arrived at Athlone from Kilkenny on Monday, and joined head quarters. A company marched from Kilkenny for Rathfriland, on the 10th, to occupy barracks; Major Boileau is arrived in Dublin from Carlow; Lieutenant Thomas Moore has proceeded on leave.

The Lieutenant General has issued a general order, in consequence of the state of the weather, directing that cloth trousers shall be taken into wear by the troops in Dublin garrison.

The Limerick cricket club will play a match against the officers of the 97th, this week. The Journal de Havre asserts that a convention is agreed upon between the French and English governments, that in case of war between the two countries steam boats of either nation conveying passengers or mails are to be considered as neutral.

The 2d regiment at Deesa is suffering severely from fever, the average number of deaths is ten per week; by the last accounts 200 men were in hospital. The paymaster'ship is vacant by the death of paymaster Moore.

The grand total capital represented by all property in Great Britain and Ireland, is estimated at £3,629,000,000. The value of all sorts of public property is £103,000,000. The value of land, ships, canals, railroads, mines, horses, timber, crops, &c., is estimated at £2,945,000,000. The value of all sorts of furniture, apparel, plate, specie, money in chancery, savings banks, &c., estimated at £580,000,000. The national debt is about £764,000,000.

John Grady, one of the Bridewell Guard in Cork, after an active search succeeded on Wednesday in recovering a valuable gold pin, and a silver snuff box which was lost a long time since by a naval officer.

Mr. John Joseph Stockdale applied at the Mansion House last night, to the Lord Mayor, to present a petition for him, against the election of Mr. Alderman Harner to the office of Lord Mayor, on account of his having published works of a blasphemous tendency.

On Sunday evening last, between the hours of seven and eight o'clock, an armed party of five men with their faces blackened, came to the house of a respectable farmer named M. Carthy, under agent to Lord Stradbroke, at Bilboa, county Limerick, and being seized on him they knocked down and beat him in a most savage manner with the butts of their guns. His wife threw herself on his body to save him from the fury of the savages, and having been seconded in her efforts by two of the party, who were more compassionate than the others, and who dragged them away from their victim, his life was spared. The scene of the outrage was very terrible, and the police are endeavoring to find out the perpetrators. It is not for this, they would have shot M. Carthy on the spot, for had they fired, the police must have come upon them. After beating M. Carthy in a most cruel manner they retreated. The only cause for this daring outrage was—the lands were lately sold by Lord Stradbroke, and M. Carthy as agent, gave notice to the tenants that they should come down and secure the arrears due by their notes, else he should drive the lands on the following Tuesday, and for thus discharging his duty faithfully his life had been nearly sacrificed.

A great revolution is at present going on in the distilling trade, from the recent discovery that potato flour or starch is capable of being fermented, and yielding a pure and well tasted spirit. Some specimens have recently been submitted to the spirit-merchants in London, which even the most experienced among them have scarcely been able to distinguish from French brandy, for even the true vintages flavour of Cognac has been successfully imitated by certain chemical compositions, which the English distillers are endeavoring to produce from potato-starch. The distilleries for the production of this kind of British brandy have recently been erected in the metropolis, and two of these are already in activity. One gentleman has imported no less than 1,000 tons of potato starch within the last three months from France and the island of Jersey for this purpose, and it is said that the dealers in this commodity are only apprehensive that the prospect of a war with France will put a sudden and speedy termination to this novel sort of traffic. The excise laws at present prevent the manufacture of starch from potatoes in Great Britain and Ireland; but it is generally supposed, by those most interested that in the next session of parliament there will be altered so as to permit the manufacture upon a very large scale.
