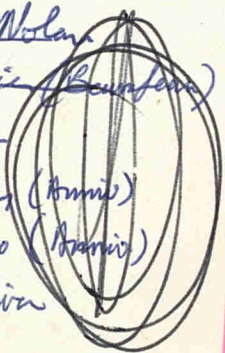

BUTLERSTOWN CEMETERY IMPROVEMENTS

Committee held their half-yearly meeting in the Convent of Mercy Hall on Wednesday May 21st, for the purpose of acquainting contributors to the fund of the progress made to date. After welcoming the attendance, the Chairman called on the Secretary to read a report of the work done by Committee members over the past few months. The main items in her report are as follows :-

- 1) Three Masses have now been arranged to be celebrated annually in Butlerstown Church for all who are interred in Butlerstown Cemetery - at Easter, November and Christ-Mas.
- 2) The noxious weed 'spunk' has now been treated - but this means that it will be six months before we can plant a belt of poplar trees on the Castle Road end of the cemetery.
- 3) The upper part of the cemetery has been sprayed by a Committee member with 'roundup'
- 4) The boundary wall on the North side has been cleared of rubbish, ivy and broken wreaths and a mechanical digger was hired after members had done the initial clearing.
- 5) A stonemason has been engaged to repair breaches in this wall.
- 6) A 'weedeater' machine and some tools have been purchased to cut grass and help on the work.
- 7) We have sought quotations for laying of concrete or tar-macadam on existing paths, which have been cleared of weeds.
- 8) A lady present at the meeting said her two sons would be willing to lay the concrete if we could get a carpenter to lay the screeds, as the quotation for laying the main footpath was approximately £ 1,000. It was decided to explore the possibility of doing this work voluntarily, and those present were asked to tell their collector of anyone willing to help us in this matter.
- 9) Also, those present were asked to keep a watch out for any one who might have surplus clay or soil available for landscaping the cemetery.
- 10) It was noted that £ 100 of the Society's funds have been invested in Prize Bonds.

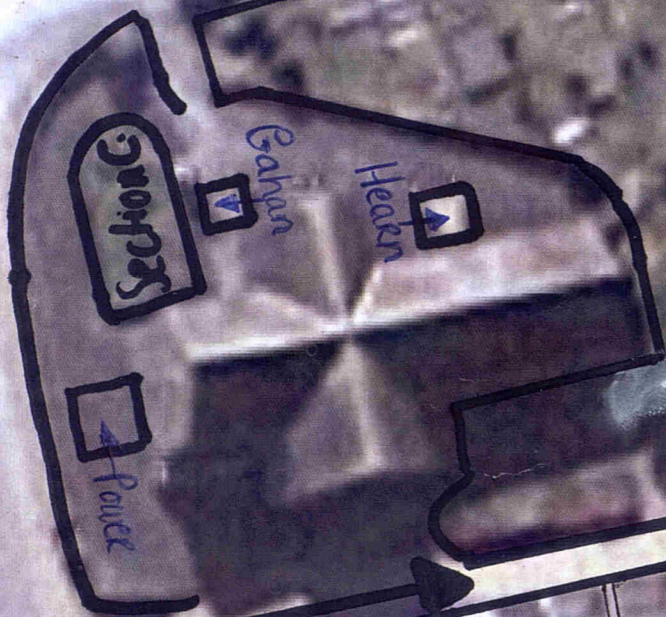
